

## U.N.B. FACULTY SALARIES ARE INCREASED

**Report of Special Committee Adopted by the Senate Today—An Increase of \$500 Has Been Granted.**

The Senate of the University of New Brunswick in special session here this morning, decided to increase the salaries of members of the faculty. The decision was in accordance with recommendation made by a special committee which was appointed some time ago to consider an application for the increase. The report was presented this morning and was adopted.

The increase adopted is \$500 per year for each member of the faculty who has served three years or more. The increase will bring salaries to \$2,800 per year. Members of the faculty who have served less than three years will receive progressive increases until the sum stated is reached.

The special committee which made the recommendation adopted was composed of Dr. F. R. Taylor, K. C., Hon. O. S. Crockett and Dr. C. C. Jones Chancellor of the University.

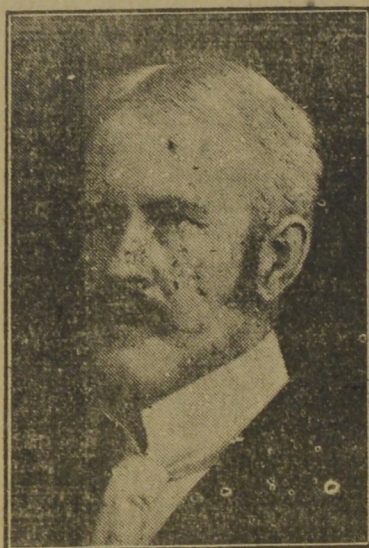

#### Thirty Years Ago.

Among the items cited from the St. Croix Courier of thirty years ago is the following: John D. Chipman, D. F. Maxwell, Hon. G. F. Hill and G. W. Ganong attended the funeral ceremonies of the late Governor Fraser in Fredericton on Tuesday. (Hon. John James Fraser, Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick, passed away in December 1896 at Genoa, Italy, where he had gone for the benefit of his health. The body was brought to his home in this city where a state funeral was held. Governor Fraser had served as a Supreme Court judge and was at one time Premier of the Province.)
