



FRENCH DRESSING NO. 1.

Rub inside of a bowl with a cut 153815314499 or bruised clove of garlic; in it mix one half teaspoon of sait, one eighth teaspoon of pepper, one-fourth tea spoon of paprika and a few grains of cayenne. Add six tablespoons of olive oil and gradually one and one half to two tablespoons of plain or tarragon vinegar, stirring constantly until thoroughly blended. A cube of ice put into bowl while stirring will aid in chilling the mixture.

French Dressing With Variations.

To the above mixture add one-half teaspoon of garlic salt and tomato ketchup to suit the individual taste (from one to three tablespoons). A teaspoon of sugar may be added and is considered an improvement

Ottawa, Feb. 14-An amusing echo of wartime war-horse scandale was heard in the House Friday afternoon. when A. deWitt Foster (Hants Kings) was delivering his contribution to the debate on the Sutherland amend nent.

His flow of oratory was interrupted by a cry of "Whoa!" from J. F. Pouliot (Temiscouta).

"I am not surprised at that interruption," said Mr. Foster, after a painful silence. "I have heard the bray of an ass from that side before.

"Horses, not asses," was the prompt retort from Mr. Pouliot, and the House caught on, recalling that Mr. Foster had been read out of the Conservative party by Sir Robert Borden for his action with respect to the purchase of war horses in 1915.

TEA AND SILK STOCKINGS ARE BLAMED

Belfast, Feb. 15-Tea drinking is ruining people, and silk stockings are to blame for some present-day illnesses, Dr. Dennis O'Hagen, surgeon of Louth County Infirmary, so told a committee called together to discuss the treatment of tuberculosis.

"What is required," he said, "is a health campaign to get people to feed themselves properly. I advise people to drink less tea and to get back to the days of 'stirabout' and 'buttermilk' There would be less tuberculosis if people took this advice." Stirabout is a porridge of oatmeal or commeat boiled in water and stirred.




