RIFFIAN TRIBESMEN MADE SHARP ATTACK ON SPANISH CONVOY

The First Serious Outbreak Since the Capture of Abd-El-Krim, the Riffian Chieftain — Nine Spaniards Killed and Forty-eight Reported HAD BECOME Wounded—Convoy Was Looted.

FEZ, MOROCCO, July 7—The first serious outbreak of Riffian tribesmen since the capture of Abd-El-Krim the former Riffian leader, by the French and Spanish forces is reported here by a courier who arrived from the Spanish zone.
