In taking the third heat in 2.03 4-5, the Peter Volo filly clipped one second of the record for the stake, established in 1915 by Hollyrood Bob which like today's winner was bred owned and driven by John L. Dodge of Lexington, Ky.

### HAGEN TELLS WHAT HE DID SAY IN ENGLAND

Reneges on the Phrase "Gosh Darn" — Did Not Say British Golfers Were Lazy.

New York, July 6—Walter Hagen, American professional golf champion in a statement issued branded as false an interview appearing recently in the London Evening News quoting him as having said that British golfers needed pep and fight while the younger ones were "too gosh-darned lazy."

Hagen asserted he had never enjoyed a golfing campaign more than his recent visit to England that he had made six trips there and looked forward to returning.

The champion declared that the story in the London paper was garbled in sensational fashion and chided American editorial writers for failing to discern that "gosh darn" was not an expression used by Americans except on the stage.

"I arrived in Great Britain, June 3 and played golf practically every day until the Aquitania sailed June 26. The only interview I had with a newspaper correspondent was immediately following the championship in the Majestic Hotel, at St. Annes.

"I did not volunteer any information and merely answered questions which were asked me by George Greenwood of the London Telegraph.

No one has been kinder to me than Greenwood, and the British writers have always given the Americans the finest sort of treatment.

"I was asked why the British players had not done better and what effect I thought seven Americans finishing in the first 10 in the British open would have on international golf?

"I replied that I thought the Americans saved more shots than the British players when within pitching distance of the cup and especially on the greens where the Americans were always giving the ball a rap for the hole, hoping for a birdie.

Americans Work Harder.

I said I thought American amateurs worked harder at their game than British amateurs and played more golf with professionals than the British, and that this helped to improve their game.

### MILLE LENGLEN SERIOUSLY ILL

London, July 6—Suzanne Lenglen whose attack of neuritis forced her withdrawal from the Wimbledon lawn tennis tournament as well as cancellation of her plans for presentation at the Royal Court, left for France, Sunday.

She told newspapermen, Sunday that her health was getting "worse and worse," and added: "I have no peace." Asked if she would return to England this year, she replied: "I hope to play at Cromer in November, but I cannot tell yet. I must see my doctor in France first."
