SWEETSER IS WELCOMED AT GOLF SHRINE

American Who Won the British Amateur Golf Title Hero at St. Andrews, Scotland—Official Welcome.

St. Andrews, Scotland, June 1—St. Andrews, the world's golf shrine welcomed Jesse Sweetser, new amateur golf champion of Great Britain. With his fellow members of the Walter Cup team, Sweetser left the scene of his victory at Muirfield and motored through 75 miles of beautiful Scotch countryside to the famous golfing center, where on Wednesday and Thursday the Americans in foursomes and singles play will defend the trophy which is the symbol of team supremacy in the ancient game.

Officials of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club the parent golf organization of Great Britain welcomed Sweetser in formal manner but he was given an enthusiastic reception by the youngsters of the Walker team, George von Elm, Ronald MacKenzie and Watts Gunn who were sent on ahead to spy out the fairways and greens of St. Andrews as soon as they were eliminated from the Muirfield competition.

It was the wish of the United States Golf Association officials that all the American Walker players go to St. Andrews as soon as possible for practice, but the veterans of the team flatly refused to leave Sweetser alone at Muirfield.

They remained to see him win and participate in the celebration of crowning him champion. A compromise was reached when it was decided that the younger members should go on ahead.

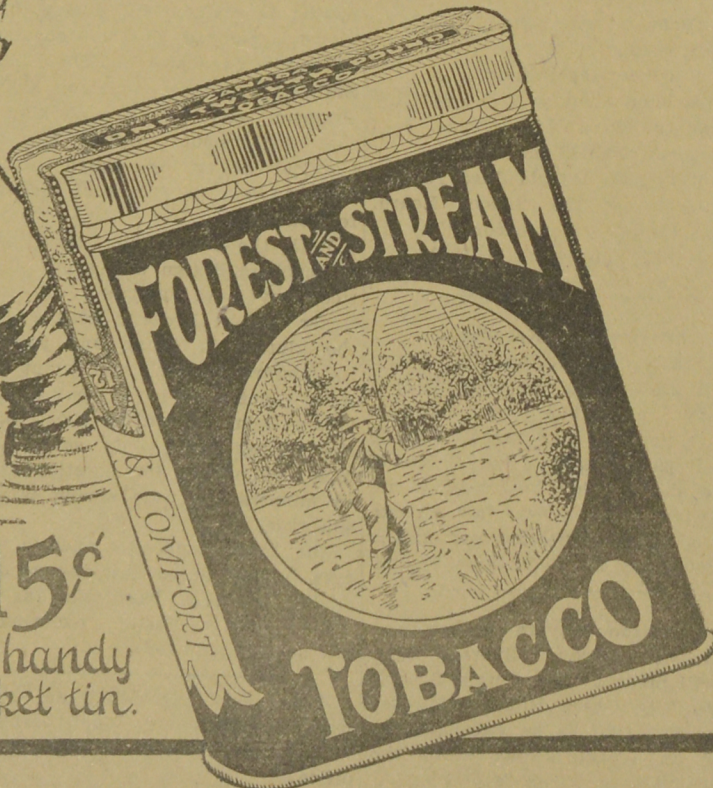

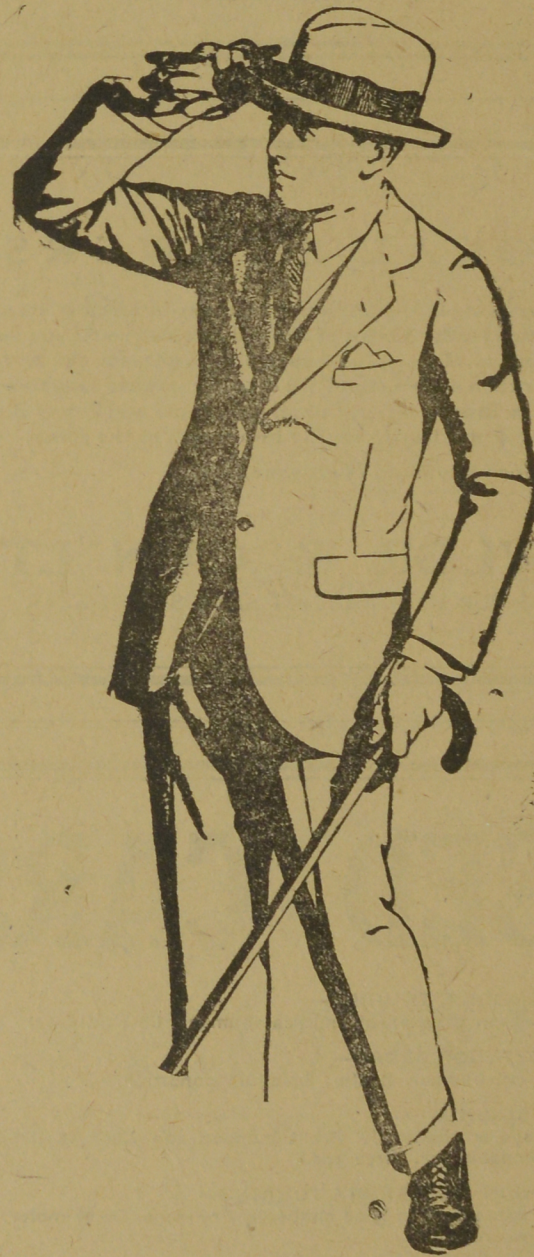
