

### CHINCHILLA RABBITS REARED AT M'LEOD HILL

#### New Brunswick Rabbits Limited Incorporated by Local People—Rabbits for Breeding and Fur.

New Brunswick Rabbits Limited, is incorporated with head office at Douglas, York County. The capital stock is five thousand dollars. Those incorporated are Leon A. Thurrott, Warren J. Maxwell and Abner B. Belyea all of Fredericton. The company is authorized to engage in the business of breeding and rearing all kinds of fur-bearing animals.

This company already is established with its rabbit ranch at McLeod Hill, a few miles from Fredericton. The breeding of Chinchilla Rabbits is now engaging the attention of the company stock for the enterprise having been imported from England where the industry has reached large proportions. These rabbits produce the chinchilla fur of commerce. The ranch is the pioneer of its kind in this part of New Brunswick. There is said to be another near Moncton and one in Prince Edward Island. So far the local company has engaged in rearing animals for breeding.
