## BURLESQUE OF CHAMPIONSHIP IS THE TERM

Receipts of Berlenbach-Stribling Match Was \$221,000—Big Shares to the Two Contestants.

New York, June 14—Thirty-four thousand spectators paid \$221,000 to see Paul Berlenbach and Young Stribling fight their burlesque light-heavy-weight championship match in the Yankee Stadium.

The titleholder received \$78,520 for his hour's labor, while Stribling's percentage amounted to \$26,174. Berlenbach's share represented 37½ percent of the net gate while Stribling drew down the challenger's usual 12½ percent.

## CLEVELAND WINS USUAL RACING CARDS

Toronto, June 13—Efforts of State's Attorney-General Crabtree of Ohio to effect a reduction in the amount of racing in and around Cleveland have borne fruit. The Forest City had more than four months of racing last year, but the dates allotted for 1926 total less than eight weeks. Yesterday the stockholders of the \$1,000,000 Thistle-down Jockey Club asked for the appointment of a receiver for the organization. Only one meeting has been held at the costly plant. The attempted gambling coup at the Aurora course, which resulted in the poisoning of four race horses and the death of two of them, has not helped to put the business of racing in good odor in Ohio. Although the State's Attorney-General and Sheriff Kohler of Cleveland declared against betting at the race courses, the Akron and Columbus clubs "got away with it."

London, June 14—Harry Persson, Swedish boxer, won the heavyweight championship of Europe tonight by knocking out Phil Scott, the English champion, in the eleventh round of their bout at Holland Park.

Nothing was done until the third when each side added three. Babbitt opened the session with a two-bagger, but he was caught at the plate a short time later. Clark singled and went to second on the play. He stole third and also stole home by fast running. A couple of errors and Burse's wildness when he hit two batters in a row accounted for the other two runs.

Devon evened the count in the last half of the inning. Four hits, a sacrifice, an error and a stolen base, was enough to give them three runs. With the passing of this inning Wheeler went in and pitched the last four innings most effectively. Devon could not even find him for a safe hit and their scoring chances were nil.

The Imps to make sure laid the game away in the sixth, three hits, one a smashing double by Wheeler to right field, a stolen base, a couple of errors, and two singles, netted Fredericton three runs, and ended the scoring of the game.

"Buck" Rice appeared behind the bat for Devon and when he gets used to his position will be a tower of strength to the team.

Harold Hall, looked good on the initial sack last night, taking up that position after the big third inning of the Devon team.

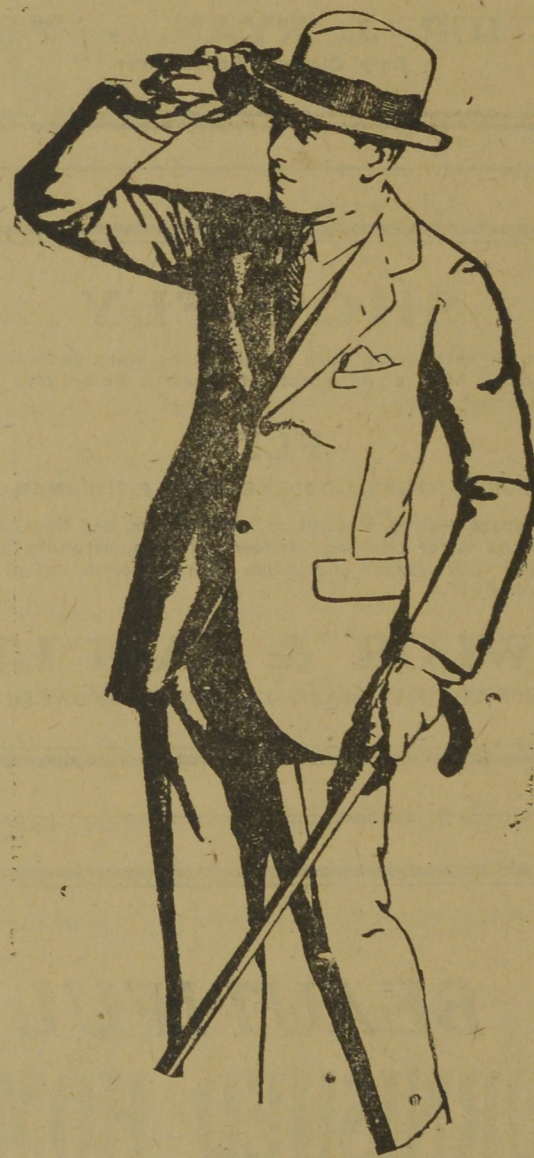

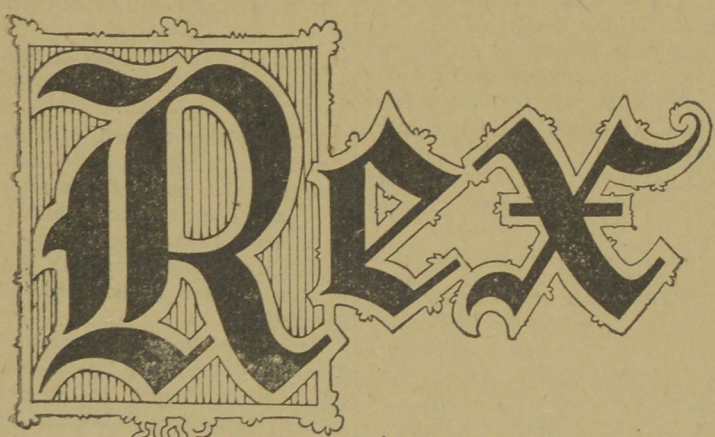

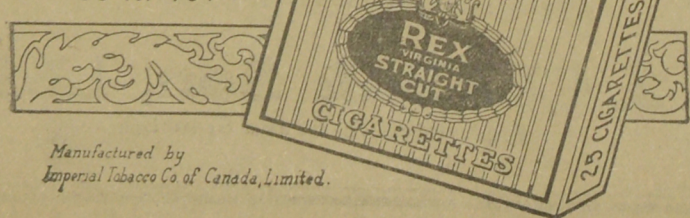
