FOR MEETING

Premier Baxter Not Expected Until Friday—
Left Ottawa Today—
Hon. Mr. Richards is There Also.

The Provincial Government is to be in session here tonight. Three members of the executive were here today. Hon. E. A. Reilly of Moncton, chairman of the New Brunswick Power Commission, Hon. J. A. Leger of Moncton, Provincial Secretary-Treasurer and Hon. D. A. Stewart, Minister of Public Works, are engaged in departmental duties. Other members of the Executive Council are to arrive tonight.

Premier Baxter who was attending the conference of Provincial Premiers at Ottawa this week did not arrive today and will not attend the opening session of the Executive Council. He left Ottawa this morning according to a despatch, and should arrive here at noon Friday.

Hon. C. D. Richards, Minister of Lands and Mines, also has been in Ottawa. He is expected to arrive here tomorrow also.

Hon. Mr. Stewart, Minister of Lands and Mines was in conference today with B. H. Kinghorn, Chief Highway Engineer. There are no contracts demanding attention at the present time.

Hon. Mr. Leger in his department today has the important matter of the latest Provincial Bond issue, tenders closing at three o'clock this afternoon.

Contract For Marysville School.
The Marysville School Board has awarded the contract for the new school in that town to H. H. & C. F. Smalley of Woodstock who also built new schools at McAdam and Hartland. The price is \$49,890. Work is to begin about the end of June and the building is to be ready about January 1st. The school is to be of brick, stone and concrete with nine classrooms. The site is part of the property once occupied by Alex. Gibson, Sr., as a residence.

In Saint John Last Winter.

TEACHING LICENSE PAPERS
STOLEN AND EXAMINATIONS
REARRANGED AS RESULT

Theft Occurred in Normal School Building Tuesday Night—Three Days' Papers Rewritten—
Locks on Door and Chest Were Unlocked—
Wax Seals of Envelopes Were Cut Around—
Opening of Envelopes Not Discovered at First.

Owing to theft of examination papers Tuesday night the entire set of examinations for Teaching Licenses conducted by the Department of Education at the Fredericton examining station, has been put over one day, the papers written Tuesday being the only papers allowed to stand. The papers scheduled for Wednesday are being rewritten today and the new schedule will not be completed until Saturday afternoon. New papers have been set by examiners to take the place of those which were tampered with.

Announcement by Dr. Carter.
Wednesday night when the candidates for the various classes appeared to be examined in Greek, French and Drawing, they were surprised to be addressed by Dr. W. S. Carter, Chief Supt. of Education and he told that the night's papers were cancelled and that all papers written Wednesday would have to be rewritten owing to

the tampering with the examination papers. Many candidates did not have to write papers last night and although steps were taken to notify them some failed to get the word. Some appeared this morning late having heard today of the new arrangement.

Some Did Not Appear.
When the new papers were given out this morning it was noticed that some candidates who had written on Tuesday and who had heard the announcement of Dr. Carter Tuesday night, did not appear to write the papers. The fact may be significant.

Locks and Seals Failed.
Locks and seals failed to protect the examination papers in the preparation and printing of which extreme care is taken. R. B. Wallace of the Education Department office staff is supervisor at the Fredericton examining station, the largest in the
