SAVORY TOAST.

1 teaspoon Harvey sauce
1 tablespoon finely chopped chicken or meat

Few grains cayenne

Few grains nutmeg

Speck of salt

1 egg yolk

2 tablespoons butter

1-2 tablespoon milk

Mix to a smooth paste. Spread on rounds of dry toast. Place in oven at 375 deg. F. a few minutes to slightly brown. Serve hot.



Ginger Sandwich.


