Seven innings of baseball with some exciting moments much hard hitting and a neck and neck race ended in a tied game four-all, between Marysville and the Imperials on the Queen's Square diamond, Monday evening. There was a pretty good attendance. The Imps as usual hit hard enough to win a couple of games. Marysville failed to hit Wheeler but made up by fielding better than Fredericton misplays. The Imperials as in other games failed to make their hits count. Of thirteen safe clouts one was for a home run and two for two bases. Earle MacPherson's three base hit was the best Marysville could do.

Myshrall was the big noise of the game. He saved Fredericton from a defeat after they twice had lost the lead, when he poled the ball in the general direction of Aberdeen street in the seventh inning with two strikes called on him. "Tot" Wheeler later in the inning hit for two bases and that was a signal for the withdrawal of Estey from the mound. But one batter faced McGinnis, who replaced him, and the pitcher threw him out. It was then
