GREAT GAME.

Campbellton Gives Fredericton Team
Credit of Fighting to Last—
Score Tied Once.

Campbellton, Jan. 14—In one of the most brilliant hockey contests ever witnessed on the North Shore, Campbellton tied up the northern league, of the M. A. H. A. here tonight by defeating Fredericton by a score of 5 to 4. A great crowd saw the winning of this crucial game, which was replete with spectacular rushes, clever stick handling and some of the prettiest combination play seen here in some years.

Both squads appeared in fine form and from the start gave the fans a genuine treat in real hockey.

This was Fredericton's first appearance here for five years and local hockey enthusiasts were anxious to ascertain just what brand of hockey they are turning out at the capital. They were not disappointed for the visitors put up a spirited game and gave the locals a hard run for their victory.

Show Improvement.

The Campbellton players showed considerable improvement over previous performances this season and especially in the closing minutes their speed was terrific and their impregnable defense failed the visitors' superhuman efforts to tie the score.

The first period started off at a very fast clip. At the very outset it was evident that both teams were out to win. Campbellton started off by keeping the puck in around the visitors' net, but before the period was half over territory play was pretty evenly divided.

LeBlanc, in the Campbellton net, gave a brilliant exhibition in this period, stopping many swift shots. Later in the period Hickson, the Fredericton goal guardian, was peppered from all sides, but refused to let the disc get by him.

Second Period.

The second period started off at a hurricane pace and both teams seemed evenly matched until Laviolette for the locals notched the opening goal of the game after 12 minutes of play. The crowd went mad with excitement and the visitors uncorked a burst of speed in an effort to tie the score. Six minutes slipped by before Jimmy Sterling found a momentary weak spot in LeBlanc's guard and drove the rubber home. The Fredericton boys put up a gallant fight until the final gong and to Hickson, in the capital net, too much praise cannot be given for the brilliant and spectacular stops he made here tonight. Upwards of a dozen times he alone saved the capital team from an overwhelming defeat.

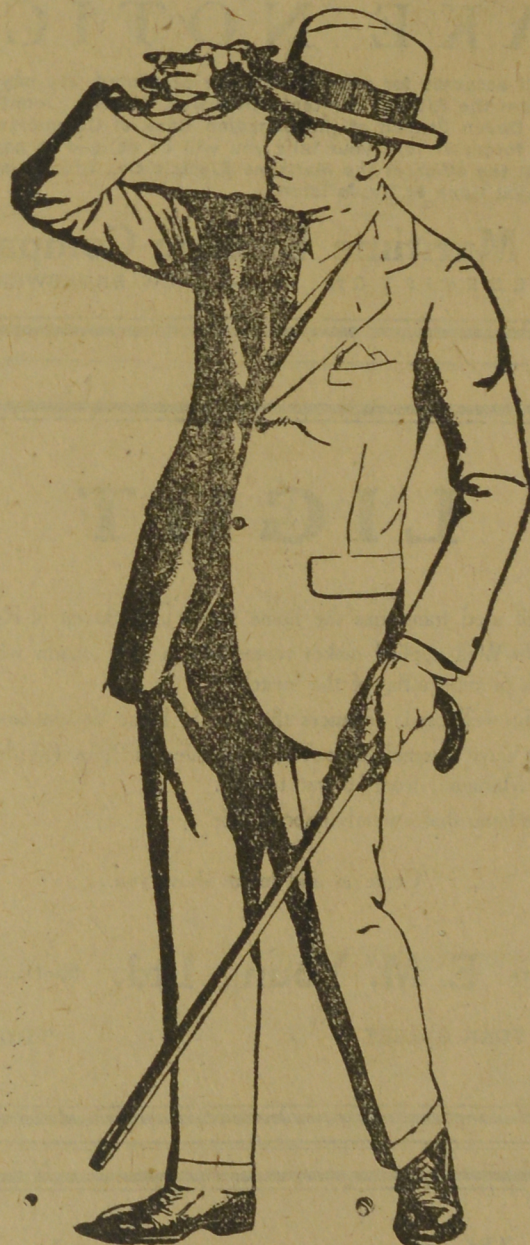
