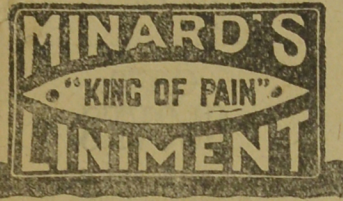

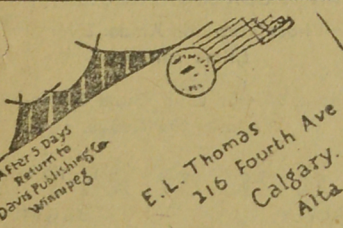
CHANGES C. P. R. TRAIN SERVICE.

SALAD COMBINATIONS.

The fourteen salad combinations listed are both appetizing and healthful and should help to solve the problem of the right salad for the right occasion.

Lettuce with any fruit, vegetable meat or fish.

Meat or fish with celery, onion and green pepper.

Cabbage with celery, green peppers and raw carrots.

Cabbage with nuts, celery and apple.

Pineapple, cream cheese, Maraschino cherries.

Grapefruit, dates, nuts and marshmallows.

White or tokay grapes and pecans.

Cooked spinach and hard boiled eggs.

Oranges or apples with Bermuda onion.

Flaked fish with celery and hard boiled egg.

Apples and nuts, raisins or dates.

Tomatoes, celery and cucumber.

Bananas and cherries, stuffed with nuts.

Watercress or Romaine with any fruit.

HAM LUNCHEON SALAD.

One cup cold boiled ham (cut in cubes).

Half cup celery (cut fine).

Half cup green pepper (cut fine).

Lettuce

Half cup dill pickle (cut in pieces)

One cup peas (fresh or canned)

One teaspoon minced onion

Mayonnaise or relish spread.

Season with salt and pepper, mix with mayonnaise or relish spread and serve cold on lettuce leaves.

Garnish with bits of tomato, pickled beets or sliced hard boiled eggs.

SALAD JAPANESE.

One and a half cups (cooked rice)

One and one half cups salmon

Salt

Paprika

Two tablespoons chopped green pepper

Four tablespoons chopped celery.

Relish spread

Mix cold rice with flaked salmon

celery, green pepper, seasoning and relish spread. Serve on crisp lettuce leaves.

TWO MINUTE SALAD.

One and one-half cups pickled beets (diced)

One small onion (chopped fine)

One and one half cups cucumbers (diced)

One tablespoon chopped parsley

Vinegar

Lettuce

Thousand Island dressing

Thin Thousand Island dressing with vinegar to taste, and pour over the vegetables that have been lightly mixed together. Add salt and pepper to taste, and serve on lettuce.

CABBAGE SPICE.

Two cups shredded cabbage

One green pepper (chopped fine)

or three tablespoons chopped nuts.

Half teaspoon salt

Lettuce

One tart apple

One pimento (chopped)

One tablespoon vinegar

Pepper to taste

Thousand Island dressing

Cut the apple in slender strips about an inch long, pour vinegar over cabbage, then mix all ingredients lightly with Thousand Island

dressing. Serve cold on lettuce leaves.

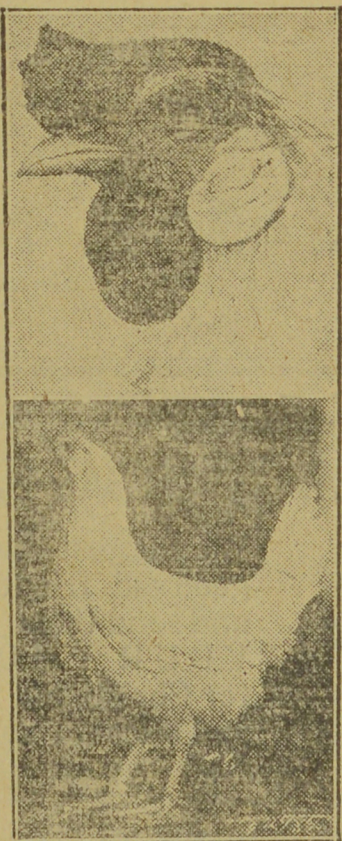
Almon Morrison who spent the summer and autumn in Boston has returned home for the winter.

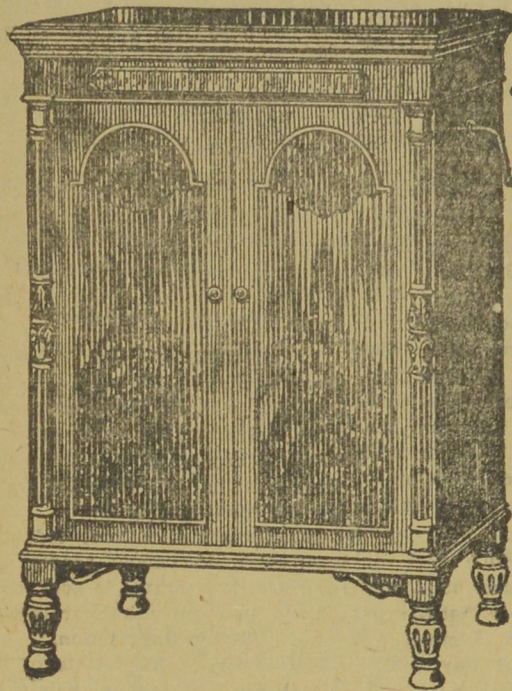
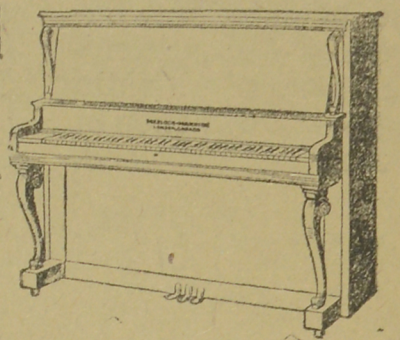
