BANANA SOUFFLE

- 1 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1-4 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon butter or margarine
- 1-2 cup milk
- 2 tablespoons melted shortening
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 3 bananas

Sift the flour, salt, baking powder and sugar together; add the milk and well-beaten egg shortenling; mix well. Brush pan melted butter, pour in the mixture. Skin and scrape the bananas and cut into four pieces and press into the dough. Sprinkle with the sugar and bake twenty minutes in moderate oven. Serve warm.

BANANA TOAST.

- 8 thin slices of toasted bread
- 1-2 glass red jelly
- 3 tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1-4 teaspoon salt Skin and scrape the nash through coarse strainer, add

sugar and salt; spread the toas with jelly, then cover with the banana mixture; garnish with a very small piece of red jelly; serve at once. A tablespoon of whipped cream over the banana mixture will make change


