Marysville dropped another in the York County Amateur Baseball League Friday night at Queen's Square when the Fredericton Imperials won 4 to 3 in an eight-inning game. Twice the Imperials had a lead and twice they lost it. The deciding run was scored by Johnny Coyle in the eighth inning with two out when L. White the Marysville third-baseman failed to envelope McGinnis' drive in proper fashion and the error let the runner cross the plate.

To date the breaks of the league have been for Marysville but Friday night was an exception and although the league-leaders played in luck, the Imps got something like an even break of the good fortune and won. The errors were even and so were the hits but the Imps came through nevertheless. Marysville still has a big margin of wins but it can be cut down. Both Fredericton and Devon are within reach of the top.

### The Scoring.

Fredericton failed to do anything in the first but in the second they hit McGinnis twice and two bad errors helped things along. Two runs were scored and Marysville never overcame the handicap. Many fans have claimed right through the season that a lead obtained on Marysville early in the game would be sufficient to win.

In the seventh the Imps seemed to make it safe by scoring another Clark going in on a sacrifice play.

In their half of the eighth Marysville made things look differently. Two errors and a three base hit netted two runs and tied the score.

The Imps had that "do or die" attitude when they went to the bat. Lister hit safely. Coyle took a fielder's choice. Hersey popped up one to the pitcher with a man on and McGinnis who had pitched his heart out slammed one at the third baseman which he failed to handle and Coyle scored, then it was all over.

## DELANEY WON LIGHT HEAVYWEIGHT BOXING TITLE FROM BERLENBACH

**Outfought Champion Last Night—New Title-  
Holder French Canadian Named Chapdelaine  
—Native of Quebec.**

New York, July 16—Jack Delaney, French-Canadian, won the world's light heavyweight title from Paul Berlenbach by decision in a terrific 15-round battle here tonight.

Round 1—The champion came out of his corner with a rush. Delaney danced around and jabbed weakly. Paul landed the first blow, a right to the body. The challenger jabbed to the face with his left. Paul bounced one of his lefts off Delaney's shoulder. Berlenbach sent Delaney on his heels with a left to the head.

**Berlenbach Stung.**  
Round 2—Delaney stung Berlenbach with a slow left to the head. The challenger ripped his left to Berlenbach's body. Delaney drove his left to the ribs and then followed with a second body blow, and the referee warned him for hitting low. Berlenbach walked into a left to the head and then took another. Delaney, using his right hand for the first time, almost floored Paul with a driving punch to the head, staggering the champion.

**Delaney Hits Other's Jaw.**

Round 3—Delaney planted a left to the jaw of Berlenbach drove to the body with his right. The challenger toured Berlenbach half around with a stinging right to the face. Berlenbach walked into a right to the body and then ripped away at Delaney's ribs with his left hand. Berlenbach stung Delaney with a left to the face and blood showed on the challenger's mouth. A vicious right uppercut caught Berlenbach wide open.

**Berlenbach Staggered.**

Round 4—Delaney staggered Berlenbach with a stinging left to the head. The challenger beat Berlenbach about the head and ribs at close range. Berlenbach drove Delaney to the ropes, but the challenger clinched. Throwing away his caution, Delaney punched openly at Berlenbach's head and body in a fierce exchange of blows. A lightning right uppercut caught Paul flush on the chin. Another right to the body landed on the champion with a resounding smack. They exchanged lefts and rights.

**Beats Champ With Right.**

Round 5—Delaney beat the champion with a right to the body. Attempting to clinch Berlenbach slipped, dropping to one knee but he was up immediately when Delaney met him with a right uppercut. Berlenbach ripped his left to Delaney's body, but the challenger came right back with a right uppercut. Berlenbach landed three lefts to the head and took a right to the body. Delaney missed a right lead and Berlenbach punished him unmercifully about the body. Just before the bell rang Delaney staggered the champion with one of his famous right hand punches.

**Delaney in Vicious Right.**

Round 6—Delaney opened up with a vicious right which all but floored Berlenbach.

lenbach. The champion clinched and scored to the body twice. Two driving uppercuts bounced off Berlenbach's jaw. Another uppercut caught Berlenbach coming in. The champion staggered Delaney with a left to the head, but Delaney slowed Berlenbach with a short right to the head.

**Delaney Staggered.**  
Round 7—Berlenbach bounded his left off the challenger's chin. He sent the challenger backward with a stabbing left to the chin. Berlenbach staggered Delaney with his left to the chin again, but he took a vicious right to the body. Delaney ripped over his right uppercut. Another left to the head brought blood from Delaney's nose, but he appeared unhurt. Delaney drove a right to the head.

**Delaney in Corner.**

Round 8—Delaney got by Paul's guard to slip a dangerous right to the chin. Berlenbach peppered away at Delaney's ribs with his left. The champion caught Delaney in a corner and drove both hands to the head and body. The challenger appeared to be weakening under the strain of Berlenbach's extra poundage as Berlenbach's left brought blood from Delaney's nose and mouth. Berlenbach took a right to the chin coming in.

**Challenger Slips.**

Round 9—Both pumped away at the body. Delaney slipped and dropped to one knee but came right up. The champion appeared as strong as ever as he ripped his left to Delaney's unprotected body. They clinched and wrestled more frequently as Delaney appeared to be tiring. The champion countered with his famous left to the head, hurting the challenger.

**Delaney Bleeding.**

Round 10—Blood was streaming out of Delaney's nose as he came up for the round and the champion rushed him all over the ring, with both gloves carrying withering fire to the head and body. The challenger was backing up at every charge, with a desperate leap Delaney stepped in and feinted with his left, drove with his right to Paul's chin but the effort was tiring and he took a steady succession to the body backing up.

**Challenger Haggard.**

Round 11—The challenger looked haggard as he came up. They swapped weak lefts to the body. Delaney tapped Berlenbach gently with his right but took the full steam of Berlenbach's left to his ribs. Berlenbach bounced a right to Delaney's nose, but took a stiff right to the jaw in the return. The champion was taking all his challenger could shoot without backing up. Berlenbach tapped Delaney's bleeding nose again but almost crumpled up under Delaney's countering right to the body just as the bell rang.

**Berlenbach Hurt.**

Round 12—Two of Delaney's rights went wild before he drove his right to Paul's chin. A stinging right uppercut hurt Berlenbach and the crowd yelled to the challenger to follow up. Another right to the head, followed by a glancing left, stunned the champion, and Berlenbach held on. Two rights to the head brought a faint trickle of blood from Berlenbach's left eye. A wild right and left uppercut both found their mark to the champion's chin and the crowd went wild, but the bell halted Delaney's gruelling attack.

**Champ Staggered.**

Round 13—The challenger came up with renewed strength. He pumped

## MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM FOR EDDIE PLANK

**Will be Erected at Gettysburg University —  
Now Under Construction — Baseball Fans  
Contributing.**

The name of Eddie Plank, once star pitcher of the Athletics and other baseball clubs, is to be perpetuated by Gettysburg College in the form of a memorial gymnasium. The Baseball Writers' Association of America has indorsed the plan, and James M. Gould, its president, will lend his hand in helping the fund. Plank was a graduate of Gettysburg.

Pres. Gould says: "A splendid player and a splendid gentleman was Eddie. He was known intimately to most members of the association and was honored by all that knew him. He gave many of his best years to baseball, and that the game is on such a high plane is due in no little degree to the efforts of Eddie Plank and his contemporary players. This association, through its president, therefore desires to become a real part of this great memorial movement, and in endeavoring the work, wishes it every success."

Eddie Plank days are being staged in many ball parks in the country and contributions made by fans. The Philadelphia Americans and Philadelphia Nationals are to play a benefit game for the Memorial some time in September.

The gymnasium is under construction now, 190 feet wide and 90 feet deep, built of steel, concrete, stone and brick. It will be completed and dedicated in November. Connie Mack Judge Landis and other baseball dignitaries are expected to attend and participate in the exercises. The cost of the gym is being paid from public subscriptions from fans. A complete list of all those who contribute is being retained for permanent file in the gymnasium.

his left to Berlenbach's body and then shot over a right to the chin. Berlenbach appeared to be tiring. Berlenbach reeled under the power of Delaney's trip-hammer right to the jaw. A left to the head staggered the champion. Then Delaney turned him around with a crushing right.

**Berlenbach Punished.**

Round 14—Delaney boxing cleverly, took Paul's left lead on his glove, then drove a light right to the jaw. A left upper cut almost floored the champion and he grappled the ropes to save himself from going down. At close quarters Delaney slipped over a short right and the blood trickled down Berlenbach's face from his cut left eye. Delaney planted a well-timed right upper cut to the jaw.

**Punching Hard at Bell.**

Round 15—They shook hands. The crowd cheered the challenger as he slapped to the feet with his left. Berlenbach stung Delaney with a right to the head and dropped his left to the body. Delaney missed with one right lead but a second later landed on Paul's open jaw. A left to the head and a ripping trip-hammer right to the body staggered the titleholder. A powerful right, travelling only a few inches caught Berlenbach under the chin and almost floored him. They were punching hard at the bell.

The new light heavyweight ring champion is Ovil Chapdelaine who fights under the name of Jack Delaney. He is a native of the Province of Quebec but for the past year or two has lived in Bridgeport, Conn.
