

## SWINDLER WAS CAPTURED AT AU REVOIR FEAST

Paris, Aug. 4.—With the arrest of Alexandre Sacha Stavisky, charged with swindles totaling 10,000,000 francs, who has eluded officials for months, the police believe that they have captured one of the cleverest and most troublesome confidence men on the Continent.

Although Stavisky's career as an expert swindler has not been long, it has been strikingly dramatic. Last February he made the first of his series of "hauls." Stavisky fleeced several bankers and exchange brokers of large sums by means of false checks. Not content with that, he went a step too far in swindling a war widow out of her pension and savings. For this Stavisky was brought to trial and apparently was due to receive a severe sentence, but, foreseeing this, he made one of the bold escapes on which his notoriety has been built.

Since then the debonaire "ten million franc crook," as the French police call him, has played hide-and-seek over half of France, always keeping two jumps ahead of his pursuers. They sought him at Crecy, La Chappelle, Houlgate, Cherbourg and also in many Paris haunts where he was reported to have been seen. It finally was discovered that Stavisky, with his secretary, Henri Hayotte, and a companion, Arlette Simon, a pretty mannequin, were living at Marly-le-Roi, a suburb of Paris. An extra large cordon of police was thrown about the house and rushed the dwelling. Stavisky, in conventional evening clothes, was seated at the head of a table bountifully heaped with edibles and liqueurs. There was a short struggle, but the swindler was quickly subdued.

## MARINE BAND WILL BE HEARD OVER C.N.R. RADIO

Montreal, Que., Aug. 5.—When "H. M. S. Calcutta," carrying the flag of Vice Admiral Sir Walter Cowan, Bart., K. C. B., D. S. O., M. V. O., Commander-in-Chief of the North America and West Indies Station arrives in the Port of Montreal early in September she will have on board a group of musicians of the Royal Marine Band and from that fact music lovers in general and radio enthusiasts in particular may anticipate a pleasant event, because arrangements have been completed by which the band will give a special concert and the programme will be broadcast through "CNRM," the local broadcasting post of the Canadian National Railways.

A year ago when "H. M. S. Calcutta" was in this port Sir James Ferguson, then Commander-in-Chief, gave permission for a broadcast, said to be the first occasion on which a band of the Royal Marines appeared before the microphone. The event proved a success and Sir Walter Cowan in granting permission for the coming concert wrote that he greatly appreciated the present invitation.

The musicians on board "H. M. S. Calcutta" are under the direction of Herbert Wright, L. R. A. M., and the tentative programme which he has prepared offers a pleasant blend of popular, light and serious music. There is, for instance, a delightful Woodford-Finden suite, "Four Indian Love Lyrics," a special Scottish composition by Mackenzie, and excerpts from the works of Sullivan, Myddleton, Alford, Puccini and Friml, the latter being recalled at the moment by "Rose Marie" and "The Vagabond King."

H. M. S. "Calcutta" is due to arrive at Montreal on Friday, the 10th September, and will remain here until Monday, the 27th September. The special broadcast from "CNRM" has been arranged for the evening of the 16th September, beginning at 9 o'clock, Daylight saving time. The cruiser will leave St. George's Bay, Newfoundland, on the 23rd August, and will proceed to Charlottetown, P. E. I., remaining there until the 29th August. She will then make for the St. Lawrence, making a stop at Tadoussac on the 31st August to the 3rd September, thence to Quebec where she will remain a week until the 10th September.



## Of Interest to the Women

### WHAT SHE WEARS.

### CANNED TOMATOES FOR STEWING.

#### (Cold Pack Method.)

The large even sized, firm tomatoes are put into wire basket or strainer. Plunge into boiling water for a minute or two, then skin and cut into pieces; pack well into sterilized jars, adjust the rubbers which have been dipped into boiling water, then put on the sterilized lids, but do not fasten. Set jar in boiler on rack, fill boiler with warm water to within one inch of the tops of jars; cover boiler and boil one half hour, remove and fasten the tops. Return to boiler and lay on sides; boil 10 minutes. Remove and dry. When cold set in cool place. If the tomatoes are watery when you skin and cut them, press gently to remove the seeds and water. The watery part can be used with soft tomatoes which are bottled for soup.

### CANNED TOMATOES, FOR SOUP AND SAUCES.

The soft, very ripe tomatoes are washed and the stem cut away. Then cut the tomato into small pieces, put into boiler with tomatoes for stewing, boil slowly forty minutes then mash through a strainer that will retain the seeds and skins; return to fire, bring to a boil; then fill into hot, well sterilized bottles. Place bottles in boiler on rack and boil one half hour. Have good, new corks in saucepan of boiling water, remove bottle, wipe, cork and when cold dip tops into melted sealing wax or parowax. This is excellent for all kinds of soups, sauces, gravies and to use in combinations where tomatoes are used.

### CANNED TOMATOES.

When buying a basket or bushel of tomatoes to can, it is best to lift them out of the basket. It mashes and bruises tomatoes to pour them out. One can give the tradesman an empty basket in exchange.

When lifting the tomatoes out sort them into two, three or four piles depending on the size of the tomatoes.

The best firm, small, even-sized ones are canned for salad; the large firm ones are prepared for stewing tomatoes; the very ripe ones, which are not so firm, are canned for soup, sauces and catsup. Late in the season about the last of September or beginning of October, when underripe tomatoes are among them, they can be used for tomato butter and pickles of which we will speak later.


