SALMON SOUFFLE.

One can salmon, half a cup soft bread crumbs, one fourth teaspoon salt, half a cup of milk, one-eighth teaspoon paprika, yolks of three eggs.

Rinse salmon thoroughly, separate from skin and bones and add seasonings. Cook bread crumbs in milk five minutes, add salmon and egg yolks beaten until thick and lemon colored; then cut and fold in whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry. Turn into buttered dish, set in pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven until firm.

EGGS AU GRATIN.

Arrange dropped eggs on a casserole dish (shallow). Sprinkle with grated cheese. Pour over tomato sauce, cover again with grated cheese and buttered crumbs and brown in oven.

TOMATO SAUCE.

Two cups of canned tomatoes; add to three tablespoons butter and three tablespoons flour, cooked together and seasoned with salt and pepper and cooked together until thick.

SCALLOP AND TOMATO SALAD.

Clean one pint scallops, parboil and drain. Add juice of one lemon, cover and let stand one hour. Drain dry between towels, sprinkle with salt and pepper, dip in flour, egg and stale bread crumbs, fry in deep fat and drain on brown paper. Cool cut in halves, marinate with dressing and serve garnished with sliced tomatoes and watercress.

LEMON PARSLEY SAUCE.

Four tablespoons butter, one tablespoon of lemon juice, salt, cayenne and one tablespoon of chopped parsley. Cream butter, add lemon juice and seasonings slowly. Serve on side of hot fish.

EGG COFFEE.

Beat an egg, white and yolk together and slowly beat into this a cup of coffee which has been sweetened to taste but which has had no cream or milk added to it. Wonderful for an energy giving coffee at breakfast or luncheon time.

LEMON SNOW.

Pour a pint of cold water over 1 ounce of gelatine; soak for half an hour. Place in a pan over fire with 3-4 pound of sugar and the thin rind and juice of 2 lemons. Gently simmer and keep stirring all the time. Pour out of pan, and when it is cold and beginning to set stir in the whites of 4 well beaten eggs and whisk all together till it stiffens. Roughly pile on a glass dish to give it a rocky appearance.

"DIFFERENT" LEMON SNOW.

Wet 6 tablespoons of cornstarch with 6 of cold water. Stir into 1-2 cups of boiling water and cook until clear. Meantime mix 3-4 cup each of lemon juice and sugar, the grated rind of one orange and two saltspoons of salt. Add to the hot cornstarch, let cook another minute and pour upon the stiff-whipped whites of 3 eggs, beating while pouring. Turn into a wet mold let harden and when chilled serve with custard sauce.
