## THE GOVERNMENT SUSTAINED TECHNICAL DEFEAT IN HOUSE; WAS IN COMMITTEE OF SUPPLY

Ottawa, March 18—The government met with a technical defeat in the house today. It came on an unexpected division while the house was in committee of supply. A couple of votes for the preventive service, department of customs, were under consideration when Sir Henry Drayton, Conservative, suddenly moved that the committee rise. At the time less than half the membership were present. The government members there, supported by eight Progressives, and two Independents voted against the motion but it carried by 74 to 41. "Resign," shouted a Conservative when the result was announced.

As is usual when the House is in committee no division bells were rung and no roll was called.

### Result of Division.

The effect of the division was that the voting of supply was brought to an abrupt termination for the day. The chairman of committee left the chair and another motion for committee of supply will have to be put on the order paper before the discussion of estimates can be resumed. Such a motion cannot be made before tomorrow.

The committee had voted nothing during the afternoon. About 5.45 p.m. Hon. G. H. Boivin, Minister of Customs, suggested that the first item for preventive service, \$250,000, could very well be passed now. There would be ample opportunity for further discussion when the report of the customs probe was before the House or when supplementary estimates came up.

### Standing Vote Taken.

Sir Henry Drayton retorted that the only check the opposition had on the government was in the vote. He did not think this item nor the succeeding one, for an amount of \$100,000 for other preventive service should be dealt with now. To bring the matter to a vote of the committee, he would move that the chairman of the committee leave the chair. The question was put, a standing vote was taken, and Sir Henry Drayton was upheld, 74 to 41.

It was past 6 o'clock by the time the vote was announced, and Deputy Speaker, William Duff, "made it 6

o'clock" without comment and the House adjourned for the dinner recess.

### Not a Goose Stepper.

Ottawa, March 18—Explaining that he did not participate in the singing of "God Save the King" on the night of the adjournment of the House of Commons, J. S. Woodsworth (Labor Winnipeg North-Centre) today made a statement on the floor of the House concerning the incident.

Much had been made in certain newspapers, said the labor leader, of the fact that he had continued his conversation with his neighbor, Henri Bourassa of Labelle, while a section of the House sang the National Anthem. A few minutes before a section of the House had been singing "Alouette" and "The Long, Long Trail." To Mr. Woodsworth, it had all seemed a very undignified proceeding. The newspaper which described him as one of three anti-British members of the House of Commons had described how the singing of "God Save the King" had been begun by a member with a loud voice, known as "Ernie." It was only when the performance was nearly over, said Mr. Woodsworth that he became conscious that the tune being sung at the moment was that of the National Anthem. He did not consider there was anything dignified or regular about the whole proceeding. He believed that there were other ways of showing loyalty and respect, and he wished to state that just because "somebody shouts 'Come on Ernie' I do not propose to click heels or perform any other kind of goose-step."

### Put One Over.

Ottawa, March 18—The Speaker was not in the chair and the House was in committee when the vote was taken and only members who happened to be in their seats could vote when the motion was put. The Government would certainly have liked to ring the division bell, but it was against the rules. The whole incident was a clever "stunt," taking advantage of the fact that there happened to be more Conservatives in their seats than Government supporters. The Government can only be ousted by the House as a House, and not when the House is acting as a committee.
