York St. Queen St.

More Expenditure at Pumping Station Required Electric Air Pump Ordered

Heating Plant Will be Necessary Later—Street Committee to Remake York Street Between George and Charlotte—Other Items of Business.

The City Council in committee last night dealt with a variety of matters. The Road Committee was authorized to oil the gravel streets and also to remake York street between George and Charlotte streets. The Water Committee was authorized to install an electric air-pump to clean the filter beds of filtration plant. There was long discussion on matters connected with new unit installation and the opinion was expressed that there would be little economy.

Air Pump Needed.

The Water Committee was authorized to install an electric air pump for cleaning the filter beds of the filtration plant by the City Council last night. The estimated cost is \$1,300. The pump which has been in use for some years is steam operated. As result of installation of the oil engine unit, steam will not be kept up and an electric air pump is needed.

Heating Plant Also.

Ald. Mitchell, chairman of the Water Committee in this connection pointed out that if steam were not to be kept up in the boilers it would be necessary to install a heating plant. When all expenditures had been made it would be found that little would be saved by the installation of the oil-engine unit.

Question of Experts.

There was discussion on a communication the Allis-Chalmers-Bullock Co. relative to furnishing an expert for the over hauling and repair of the steam unit supplied by that company at the pumping station. The communication named a fee of \$25 per day with all travelling and hotel expenses in addition.

Ald. Currier objected that the charge would be heavy and expressed the opinion that local men could be secured who could do the work.

Bills Too Heavy.

The Council also discussed the bills for expenses of Mr. Matthews and Mr. Lang employees of Canadian Fairbanks-Morse Limited, who were sent here in connection with the installation of the oil engine unit and the Sterling unit at the pumping station.

The opinion was expressed that

the charges were excessive—\$747.45 in one case and \$836 in the other. No action was taken.

Further Discussion.

Ald. Richards pointed out that the Allis-Chalmers pump was to be used as a standby from cold boilers it would take some time to put it in commission.

Ald. Mitchell said that the intention was to use the Sterling engine in the event of the oil-engine unit going bad. The Sterling engine would do the work until steam power could be brought into play.

It was suggested that an arrangement for electric current might be made with the Maritime Electric Company.

Street Matters.

Ald. Currier for the Road and Street Committee brought up a number of things in that department.

He reported that crude oil or calcium chloride could be used for treatment of gravel streets and roads to reduce dust. City Engineer had prepared estimates—\$68 per block for oil and \$91 per block for calcium chloride. Oil being cheaper it was decided to try a tank car of it as an experiment on gravel and macadam streets. The Roads and Streets committee was empowered to act in the matter.

To Remake York Street.

Ald. Currier also brought up the matter of remaking the block of tarvia pavement on York Street between George and Charlotte street. He said that the City Engineer had made an estimate of \$1,200 to scarify the pavement reduce the crown and remake it.

This also was referred to the committee with power to act.

Also on suggestion of Ald. Currier the committee was authorized to purchase a patrol machine similar to those in use in Devon and Marysville. Lately the city has been using one borrowed from the Province. The cost is \$225 plus sales tax.

Insurance Overcharges.

It was announced that New Brunswick Board of Fire Underwriters had reduced the rate on the City Hall.

Ald. Goodspeed commented upon the matter of fire insurance stating that an overcharge of \$700 a year was made compared with ordinary rates.

The matter was referred to the insurance committee.

Matter of County Claim.

An opinion from the City Solicitor P. J. Hughes, K. C., was read by Mayor Clark on the matter of the claim against the County. The opinion was of some length. In brief it was that the sum of \$4,105.57 claimed by the city could be collected and that a proper statement never had been made by the County authorities.




