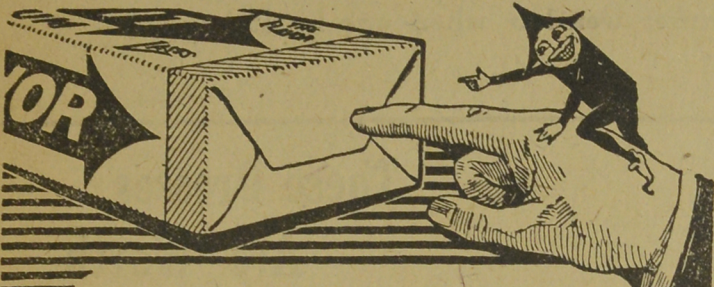

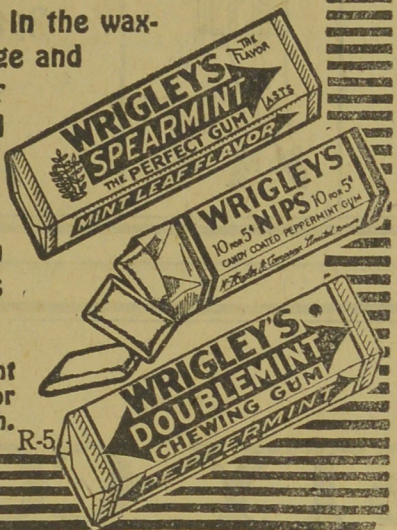

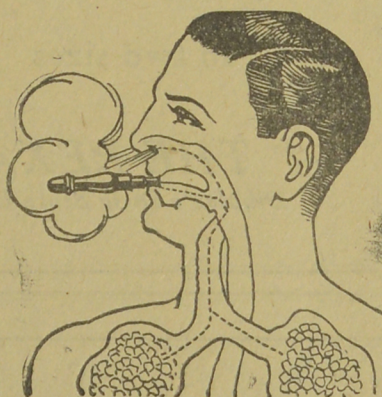
### Died at Southwest Harbor, Me.

## WALKED 600 MILES WHILE WITHOUT FOOD

New York, July 5—Bernarr Macfadden, the "Father of Physical Culture" who several days ago gave George Hasler Johnston, a thousand dollars in cash for breaking the world's endurance record by walking over 500 miles while fasting, has published a signed editorial in the New York Evening Graphic: "If the people of this country understood the stupendous importance of his feat it would have been emblazoned on the front page of every newspaper."

There has been considerable newspaper speculation as to the object of the walk and no clear explanation has heretofore appeared in print. The walk was instigated by Bernarr Macfadden, as publisher of the Physical Culture Magazine, to focus national attention to the fact that as a people we should walk more and eat less.

The knowledge secured is of world-wide importance, says Mr. Macfadden: "What would it be worth to a person stranded in a country where food is not obtainable to know he can travel great distances and still retain the strength essential to go on his way, without nourishment. The average individual actually eats himself to death."

The editorial has attracted great attention as it is the first clear statement of the object of the foodless hike.
