Messrs Phillips and Pringle Limited have withdrawn their bus from the St. John route, and until further notice it will make tri-weekly trips to Grand Falls and Edmundston. It will leave Fredericton on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays at seven o'clock a. m. returning on the following day. This new service will provide an ideal holiday trip for our own people as well as for tourists.

**Egg Laying Contest.**  
For the second time in succession the Barred Rock pen of Fred H. Ferguson of this city has headed the list in the New Brunswick egg laying contest. Last week this pen produced 57 eggs, which has been its average for some weeks. The White Leghorn pen of A. Vye Gibson of Moncton was in second place with 52 eggs. The pens of Hayfield Bros. and A. T. Reed tied for third place with 50 each. The pen of George Wood of Carters' Point still leads in the contest with 1640 eggs and 1750 points. The pen of A. T. Reed of Rollingdam is in second place with 1621 eggs and 1552.3 points.

The City Council after consideration referred the petition to the police Commission.

## POLICE STATION AGAIN UNDER FIRE BEFORE COUNCIL

**Dr. O. E. Morehouse, Chairman of Board of Health, Terms It Disgrace to Back Settlement.**

The matter of improving the Police Station which was discussed at length by the City Council a year or two ago, is again to the fore. As stated some time ago in the Daily Mail, the Fredericton Sub-district Board of Health discussed the matter and its chairman, Dr. O. E. Morehouse sent a communication to the City Council.

Monday night at the committee meeting of the Council the communication was read by Mayor Clark. The letter condemned the premises and requested attention. Dr. Morehouse criticized the premises as having no ventilation, improper toilet arrangements and cells small, dark and unventilated. The premises he said were wholly unsuited to the purpose to which they are put and would be a "disgrace to a back-country village."
