The Deaf May be Taught to Hear by Means of Their Eyes

Research Engineer of the Westinghouse Labor- CHRISTMAS atory Has Invented a Device Called "Osiso"-Translates Sound Vibrations Into Visible Waves, Which a Mirror Reproduces-Instrument Can be Carried in the Pocket.

NEW YORK, Dec. 30—Teaching the deaf to held the annual Christmas concert "hear" with their eyes is now a practicable possibility, according to J. W. Legg, research engineer of the Westinghouse Laboratories and inventor of a new device known as the "osiso".

The instrument translates sound vibrations into visible waves which are reproduced on a tiny mirror. Although the principle is old this is the first time it has ever been applied to a portable instrument.

A Pocket Device

Extensive experiments now being made by Dr. Robert Gault of the National Research Council in Washington are expected to lead to development of a device to be carried in the pocket by deaf persons.

By watching the mirror it would be possible for them to hear ordinary conversations and even
