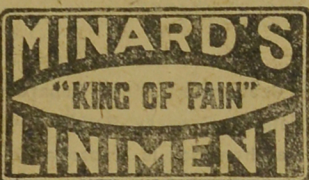

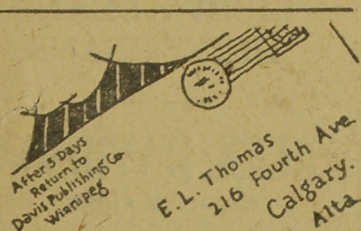
#### CHANGES C. P. R. TRAIN SERVICE.

## Of Interest to the Women

#### MY NEIGHBOR SAYS.

Save the broom handles. They will come in handy for moving heavy furniture and trunks. Two handles act as rollers.

To brighten gold braid give it a thorough brushing, then sprinkle powdered alum all over it and let it stay on for two or three days. Then brush it off.

To remove tar or grease marks from the most delicate fabrics soak a piece of white rag in eucalyptus oil and rub it on the affected part until the latter is quite clean.

Always cook dropped eggs in boiling water to which a few drops of vinegar are added. The vinegar helps set the white without injuring it even if served to an invalid. Butter with the tiniest piece of butter the egg-litter when taking the egg from the water. This insures the safe removal of the eggs without breaking.

To remove the deposit from the inside of tea kettles fill the kettle with water and add to it a dram of sal ammoniac. Let it boil for an hour when the fur, or petrified substance found in the metal will be dissolved and can be easily removed. Rinse the kettle well then boil out once or twice before using the contents.

For a finger marked piano or other highly polished surface of furniture try cold water and chamois skin. Have two skins, both very soft and pliable. Dip one in cold water, wring it very dry and then polish with the dry skin. Never apply coal oil or any patented polish the ingredients of which you do not know. One woman who used coal oil on cleaning days soon found that the entire surface of her piano was marked by tiny cracks.

#### Chocolate Cocomat And Marshmallow Fudge.

1 cup shredded cocoanut  
3 cups granulated sugar  
¾ cup milk  
1 square chocolate or 1-3 cup cocoa

1 tablespoon butter  
2 cups marshmallow whip  
Put the sugar, milk and grated chocolate or cocoa into saucepan over very slow fire and stir until dissolved; add butter and boil very slowly until the soft ball stage is reached. It takes about 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from fire, add the cocoanut, then beat until it creams; pour on platter that has been buttered and cover with the marshmallow whip, then with the fudge; set in cold place until firm. With a warm knife, cut it into squares.

#### COCOANUT DROPS.

1 cup shredded cocoanut  
2 cups sugar  
Pinch of cream or tartar  
¾ cup water

Put the sugar and water into shallow saucepan over fire, stir until the sugar is dissolved then boil slowly, stirring constantly until it forms a soft ball when tried in cold water; remove from fire and add the cream of tartar and cocoanut; stir until cooled; then drop from spoon onto oiled or buttered plates. A few drops of vanilla can be added, if desired.

#### MAPLE FIG BARS.

2 cups maple sugar  
1 cup chopped figs  
¾ cup milk  
¼ teaspoon cream of tartar  
1 teaspoon lemon flavoring  
Grate or shave the sugar put into iron pan with the milk and cream of tartar. Boil slowly 15 minutes; add the figs and flavoring and boil one minute. Pour into buttered pans and cut into strips or blocks while warm.

#### STUFFED DATES.

Wash and dry the dates make an incision in side with sharp knife and remove the stone; fill the cavity with blanched almond English walnut or marshmallow. Press together and roll in sugar.

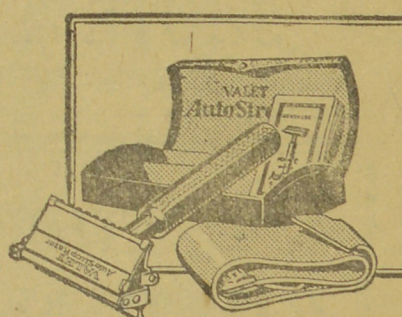
