CERTAIN STYLES FIXED FOR SUMMER.

We know now certain fundamental things about the spring and summer fashions which will be lasting facts. We know, for one thing, that skirts are short—extremely short. Many of them for tall girls reach eighteen inches from the floor on some short words, they touch the knees or just an inch or two below them. The distance from the floor is determined by the height of the figure, because if you made a skirt eighteen inches from the floor on some short girl then there would be a scandal in the town.

Another fact about the new spring clothes which is now established is the one that skirts are full without being circular in any degree. They are pleated interminably one pleat upon another or in accordion pleats or in sets of fine side pleatings. But the lengths of these pleated sections or skirt or whatever they may be are short where they show.

For instance, one of the smartest of the early spring frocks seen was the one from Paris made of gray tussah and tailored within an inch of its life. The entire skirt was a series of inch and a half wide box pleats pushed up one against the other and stitched down flat to within six inches of the bottom of the skirt.

At the point where the stitching stopped the pleats continued to be pressed down flat in the continued lines started by the stitching. The flare then became uniform and even and the general perkiness of the effect is something to delight the heart of any girl.

The point that tailoring is a part of the modern mode cannot be too strenuously accented. Tailored clothes of all sorts are very good—not only the tailored suits which have had so much advertising, free and otherwise but the tailored topcoat, the tailored silk dress and the tailored woolen dress have their swing this season.

STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE.

Sift together two and one half cups of flour, one half cup of corn starch, six teaspoons of baking powder and one teaspoon of salt. With the tips of fingers lightly rub in one half cup of shortening. Add gradually one and one half cups of rich milk and mix to a soft dough. Spread the dough in evenly in two deep, well-buttered layer-cake pans. Bake in a hot oven fifteen minutes. Remove from pans

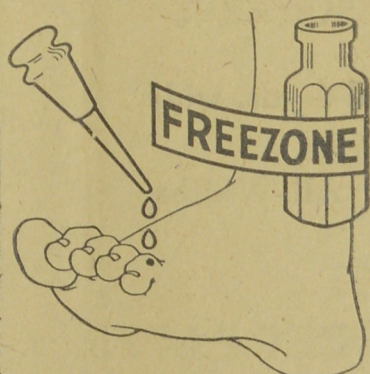
