

TOURIST CAMP  
GROUND HAD 486  
REGISTRATIONS

British Columbia, California and Florida the Most Distant Points—Camp Ground Greatly Appreciated.

The Tourist Camping Ground which is maintained by the City of Fredericton on the Old Government House property in Woodstock Road which is placed at its disposal for the purpose by the Federal Government has proven as popular within the past summer as ever. Parties which used the camping grounds numbered little fewer than two thousand persons. The total number of parties registered was 486. The registration began July 1st and closed in October when the motor-tourist season ended with the increasing coldness of the weather.

From Distant Points.

The registration included many of the states of the Union, with Florida and California the most distant. The New England States furnished the most of the motorists tourists with Atlantic States furnishing almost as many. Practically all Canadian Provinces were represented British Columbia being the most distant.

The Details.

Some early parties were not on the register but for four months the registration of parties was as follows: July 147, August 248, September 85, October 6. This indicates that August is the popular month probably on account of the heat in American sections. The same is true to some extent of Ontario a number of parties coming from that Province.

Appreciate the Grounds.

The Fredericton Tourist Camp Grounds have earned an enviable reputation for themselves, among motor-tourists during the few years they have been operated. The people who use them appreciate the location and particularly the facilities in the matter of water, electric-light, camp-kitchens, toilet arrangements.

Morris Allen is in charge of the camp grounds with powers of constable. He also is caretaker of the D. S. C. R. properties in the vicinity.

INSPECTORS  
AND TEXTBOOK  
COM. TO MEET

Chief Supt. of Education to Attend — Textbook Changes — Recent Suggestions in Effect Long Ago.

The semi-annual conference of School Inspectors of the Province with the Principal of the Normal School and the Chief Supt. of Education, is to take place here on the 30th, possibly going over to the next day. The usual subjects are to be discussed according to Dr. W. S. Carter the Chief Supt. of Education.

Textbook Conference.

During the Christmas vacation the Maritime Textbook Committee jointly appointed by the three Provinces is to meet again. Dr. Carter will attend the meeting. Changes in textbooks in the Maritimes have been under discussion and recommendations may be made.

Suggested Changes.

Commenting upon suggested changes in the system of education in New Brunswick which have received a certain degree of publicity locally within the past day or two, Dr. Carter states that several of the suggestions have been in effect in New Brunswick for some time, some of them for many years. A four year course in High School is a fact. Junior High Schools also are in existence and Latin is not a compulsory subject in any grade of the schools.

Egg Laying Contest.

The pen of George Wood led in the New Brunswick Egg Laying contest aist week with 47 eggs and 40.5 points. Other pens which made a good showing were those of the Experimental Station with 45, John Woods with 44, W. E. B. Tait with 41, Harry Patterson with 33, James Monahan and N. W. Eveleigh with 29 each. The total production for the week was 516 and the total at the close of the seventh week was 2110.

NASHWAAKSIS  
SITE OF PAXEASY  
BARREL COMPANY

Building at Dam on the Nashwaaksis River is Taken—Elwood Burt Elected President of Company.

The Canadian Paxeasy Company Limited which is to manufacture hardwood barrels and other hardwood lines at Nashwaaksis about two miles from this city, will be incorporated this week. The capital stock is to be \$755,000 and the head office is to be in the Parish of Douglas.

Officers Elected.

The company has elected the following officers and directors;—President, Elwood Burt, Fredericton; Vice-president, W. D. Wilkes, New York City; Secretary-Treasurer, J. Stanley Scott, Fredericton.

The three officers are also the board of directors and the incorporators of the company.

Take Nashwaaksis Plant.

The company since its promotion has had various sites in view including several in Fredericton. The final selection is the building of the Hawkins Lumber Company which has been used in recent years by that company as a factory. It is located at the dam on the Nashwaaksis River and is partially equipped now. At one time it was the Alex. Thompson property. A C. P. R. siding will be put in.

A meeting of the company was held Monday night in the office of C. R. Hawkins. The business of the company was discussed. In a short time the plant will be turning out its product.
