The Voice of Mussolini To be Heard Over Radio

Station W G N Chicago Will Broadcast Speech Delivered by the Italian Dictator in Chigi Palace-Speech Was Recorded by a New Electrical Device—Will Be Translated Into English.

(Special to the Daily Mail by the British United Press)

CHICAGO, Dec. 13—The voice of Mussolini, dictator of Italy will be heard over the radio on Tuesday night, marking the first time in broadcasting history that the voice of an European statesman has been brought here.

Station W G N Chicago will broadcast the speech which the Italian premier delivered several weeks ago in Chigi Palace. Mussolinis message is to the American people and the Italians, living in America. His voice was recorded by a new electrical device. The speech, which is nine minutes long is in Italian. It will be followed by an English translation.
