The Fredericton Imperials took another step upward in the York County Amateur Baseball League Friday night when they beat Devon 3 to 1 at Queen's Square in five innings. The game ended with Devon finishing their half of the inning although the light was good enough for further play.

Timely hitting gave Fredericton their runs. On the other hand Devon could not do much damage to "Tot" Wheeler's offerings not hitting him safely until the fourth inning.

The fielding was very ragged with Devon the most serious offenders. Jack Watson in centrefield had three bad ones on fly balls all of which he misjudged. H. Miles was away off on pop fouls behind the bat. The Imperial errors were not serious except Coyle's in the fourth. J. Watson hit safely along the left foul line but well inside it. Coyle started for the ball but let it lie claiming that "foul ball" had been called. There had been no such call. Watson scored Devon's only run and had the ball been handled as it should Devon very likely would have had a shutout.

The Scoring. Fredericton started out like a winning aggregation. After holding Devon down in the first, Malloy alone getting on through Myshrrall's error on a dropped third strike, the Imps went after Burse. Hersey hit safely. Clark sacrificed. Shannon fled out but Myshrrall hit scoring Hersey. He stole second and he scored when Jack Watson failed to handle Lister's long fly. Coyle ended the inning hitting to the first baseman but the two runs scored were enough to win the game.

In the second the Imps made another Wheeler getting on when Watson missed another long fly in centrefield. Hall drew a pass. Howell fled out but Hersey and Clark each hit safely Wheeler scoring. In each of the following innings the Imperials got men on but Devon managed to pull out each time.

Devon's only run was made in the fourth by means of two hits and an outfield error.

Some Good Fielding.

Interspersed with the poor fielding was some good work. Wheeler was responsible for a nice double play in the second when E. Miles played too far off first. In the third Hersey took Burse's drive and threw him out from an almost impossible position. In the fifth he narrowly missed doing the same on a short one laid down by the same player but was off his balance and it had to go for a hit. 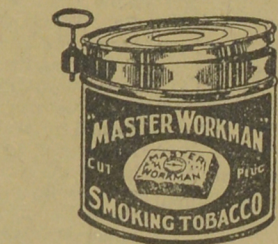
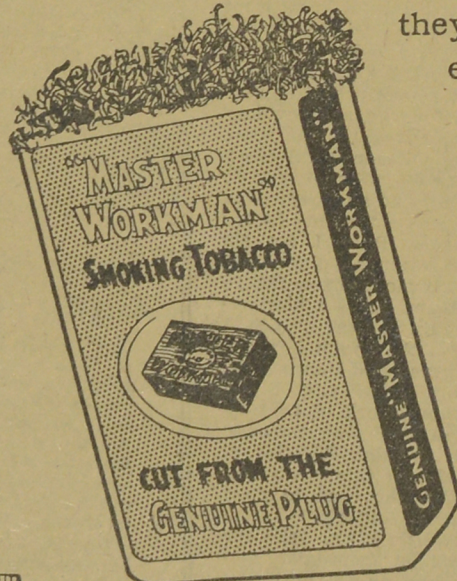
