

REVISORS ASK CITY FOR MORE SALARY

Bond Issue of \$20,000 is Ordered for Permanent Road Improvement — Business Before City Council.

In committee last night the City Council received from the Revisors an application for an increase in salary from \$100 to \$200. The application set forth that there had been a great increase in the work of the office on account of the inclusion of the names of women in the electoral lists. The Revisors appointed and paid by the city are Walter B. Burden and Abner R. Belyea. The chairman is M. A. Hagerman who is appointed and paid by the Province, receives the same recompense as the other members of the Board.

The City Council postponed action until January at the time the appointments will be made.

Pumping Station Repairs.

Repairs to the Allis-Chalmers engine at the pumping station of the city water-works cost \$2,051.11 of which upwards of \$700 was for parts from the Allis-Chalmers-Bullock Co. The engine is now in as good condition as ever it was. The work was done under City Engineer J. D. MacKay and Chief Engineer John Malloy of the pumping plant.

Assessment Forms.

The matter of the form of return to be filled by each ratepayer under the new Assessment Act was discussed last night by the City Council. The Finance Committee was authorized to act with the Board of Assessors in the selection of the forms.

Expenditure on Roads.

A total expenditure on Permanent Road Account of \$19,555.33 was reported. Of that \$5,659.11 was on the New Maryland Road and \$13,896.22 on the Lincoln Road. To meet this debt to the face value of \$20,000 will be issued by the city.

New Thawing Boiler

The Roads and Streets Committee has been authorized to purchase a six horse-power boiler at a cost of \$228 f. o. b. Fredericton. The boiler is to be used for thawing during winter and spring. The boiler formerly used had thirty years of usefulness.

Honor For Col. McLeod.

Saint John Globe: Lieut.-Colonel N. P. McLeod, Federal Taxation Inspector here, former Commander of the 3rd N. B. Artillery Brigade, has been appointed Aide-de-Camp, representing this province, to the Governor General, it was reported today. Colonel McLeod, to whom the high honor has come is a veteran of the South African War and of the Great War.

Body Arrived Today.

The body of Miss Lima M. Stickles daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James W. Stickles of North Devon arrived this afternoon from Montreal where her death occurred Sunday after an operation in Royal Victoria Hospital. The deceased had been a patient at Riverglade Sanitarium at various times during the past three years. The deceased is survived by her parents, one brother Andrew and two sisters Leah and Catherine all at home. W. E. Long a cousin of the deceased accompanied the body here. The funeral will take place Wednesday afternoon leaving the home at 1.30. At two o'clock service will be conducted in St. Mary's Parish Church by Rev. N. P. Fairweather. Interment will be made at Sunny Bank Cemetery.

NUMEROUS BEQUESTS UNDER ROBINSON WILL

Admitted to Probate on Monday Afternoon — Residue to Same Beneficiaries — Canterbury Will Probated.

The will of Mrs. Mary Hyde Robinson was probated Monday afternoon before Judge H. G. Fenety. C. R. Hawkins was proctor and Dr. S. F. A. Wainwright is named executor. The will provides for a large number of bequests the personal belongings of the deceased being given in that way a list of some fifty articles being attached to the will. In addition there are a considerable number of bequests of varying amounts the total making up some \$2,500. The residue of the estate after these bequests are made is bequeathed to the same beneficiaries in proportion to the amounts originally bequeathed.

The late Mrs. C. S. Brannen whose death occurred a few days ago is left \$500. She was a sister of testatrix. Mrs. Emily Murray formerly Mrs. Emily McDonald is left \$600. She is residing in California. Archibald McDonald is left \$200 and Rev. G. E. R. MacDonald a resident of California is left \$300. A large number of small bequests also were made.

The estate was probated at a value of \$8,350 all personal property. During her lifetime the testatrix had the use of the estate of her husband but on her death that property went to those specified in the will of the husband the late Col. John Robinson.

Canterbury Estate.

In the estate of Edmund M. Cummings of Canterbury letters testamentary were issued to E. McLeod Cummings executor named in the will. The estate consists of \$1,060 of which \$860 is real and \$200 personal. C. J. Jones of Woodstock was proctor.

JOHN F. ROGERS APPOINTED TO NORMAL STAFF

Becomes Assistant Instructor During Absence of Principal Bridges on Leave — Teacher of Experience

Announcement was made today by Dr. W. S. Carter, Chief Supt. of Education, that John F. Rogers of this city had been appointed Assistant Instructor in the Provincial Normal School for the period during which Dr. H. V. B. Bridges, Principal, will be absent on leave. That period is from January 1st to June 30th. Dr. H. H. Hagerman is to be Acting Principal for the period.

Well Known Teacher.

The appointment of Mr. Rogers will be received with pleasure by many as he has a wide circle of acquaintances in New Brunswick. He is a native of King's County but taught in Fredericton for many years being principal of the Model School which is conducted in conjunction with the Normal School.

Mr. Rogers is a teacher of experience in addition to having experience in commercial life. He was in the West for some years and since his return taught at Keswick Ridge, Fredericton Junction, in this city and elsewhere.

Egg Laying Contest.

The Barred Rock pen of Mr. George Danby of North Devon led in the New Brunswick egg laying contest at the Experimental Station last week with 36 eggs. The pen of Harry Patterson of Hoyt produced 37 eggs but of lighter weight, and one of his birds was disqualified. Other pens which made a good showing were those of George Wood with 32 and R. A. Snowball with 25. With one exception all of the twenty pens are now at work. The total egg production for the week was 332 and the grand total at the end of the fifth week was 1240.
