

## Jack Delaney gets K. O. Over Humbeck at Boston

**Given Technical K. O. in Sixth Round—Rapier of North Concedes 21 Pounds—Humbeck's Eyes Both Closed at Finish.**

Boston, Mass., Jan. 20—Jack Delaney, of Bridgeport, Conn., scored a technical knockout over Jack Humbeck, Belgium heavyweight champion, here tonight, when the referee stopped the bout to spare the Belgium fighter punishment. Humbeck's left eye was completely closed, and with the right fast closing he was having difficulty in seeing his opponent. Delaney had given away 21 pounds to his opponent, the former weighing 178 as against Humbeck's 199. The referee's interference came in the sixth round.

In the fifth round Humbeck began to feel the full weight of Delaney's attack. In this round, Delaney closed Humbeck's eye with a series of stinging left jabs and knocked him down with a right smash to the jaw for a count of eight.

### Delaney Scores Easily

Throughout the match Delaney scored almost at will with his left jab and right uppercut. Humbeck proved dangerous at times, however, with a swinging left and a swinging right which caused Delaney to treat his opponent with the utmost respect.

Humbeck's heavy swings often found their marks on Delaney and a trickle of blood from Delaney's nose indicated the extent of the damage they caused.

## BATHURST BEAT FUSILIERS 6-2

**Show Supremacy Last Night at Saint John—Fans Disappointed at Soldier Team's Showing.**

St. John, Jan. 20—The Pulp Town ice masters from the north of the province swooped down on the Fusiliers and brought about their Waterloo in an exhibition game here Friday night before one of the largest crowds of the season. Bathurst rolled in six scores while the local boys notched up two. The visitors' win was one of the most decisive seen on local ice and they also presented the most formidable aggregation that has been seen here in many a season. Why the Fusiliers' management, which should have known that the players would meet their toughest opposition in the Bathurst sextette, did not give more consideration to the spectators and assemble a team which would make an equal contest, is the question asked everywhere by the fans present who were entirely disgusted at the locals' showing. It was the consensus of opinion that nothing more effective could have been done to kill the popularity which the game is fast gaining in this city.

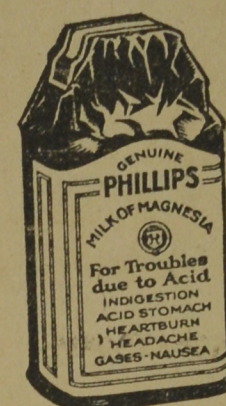
A bright future is predicted for Senator Ford. He is a half-brother to Peter Speedway, champion of Europe
