

RUNNING BARBER
IN 10 MILE RUN
THIS EVENING

Percy Gullison Enters
Halifax Race in Good
Condition—Track Re-
ported Fast—Forty
Entries.

Percy N. Gullison, local runner, who is entered in the Halifax 10-mile run, which is to take place tonight at the Wanderer's Club Grounds in Halifax, arrived in that city last evening, and the report received here that he is in good condition and ready to run. The race commences at 7 o'clock, which will give the runners the advantage of the cool part of the evening for the grind. The race is to be run on a half-mile track, and many local fans think that this condition will be against the A. & B. Club runner. The record for the 10-mile jaunt at Halifax is 57 minutes and is jointly held by Michelson, Taylor and others. Gullison is of the opinion that he can complete the course in 5 minutes under ideal weather conditions. If the "running barber" can do this, it will certainly give any of the other competitors a lively skirmish for the initial position.

Expectations are that approximately forty will enter in the event, the majority of whom are Nova Scotians, with a sprinkling of New Brunswick runners and Cape Bretoners. The report from Halifax is that the track is lightning fast and everything is in readiness for the big run.

Gullison is entering the race with the utmost confidence and even if he doesn't win, will give his best for the A. & B. Club, under whose colors he is running. Many fans here think that he will come through.

Eggs sold for 30 cents and butter for from 38 to 35 cents. Live pigs went for \$3.50.

RENEWED FAITH
IN OUR FUTURE
URGED IN SERMON

Bishop Seagre Makes In-
spiring Address to the
Anglican Synod—
Faith and Co-operation
in Our Future is
Plea.

That the history of Canada shows a working out of the "eternal purpose of God among the nations as truly as does that of Israel of old," that out of the "few loaves and small fishes of the four original provinces the Fathers of Confederation laid the foundation for a great Canadian nation" and that faith and effort in both church and national life are needed in the future were the points urged by the Right Reverend Charles A. Seager, Bishop of Ontario, in his address to a large meeting of both laymen and clergy of the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton, at Christ Church Cathedral last evening. A big and appreciative audience filled the church and gave close attention to Bishop Seager's words. 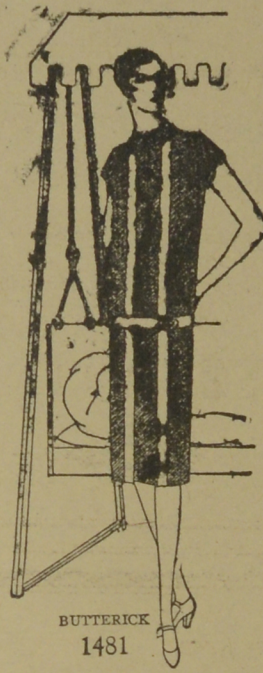

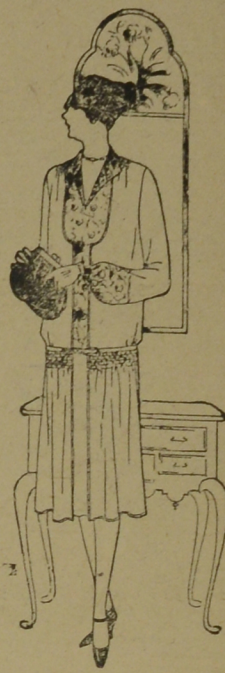

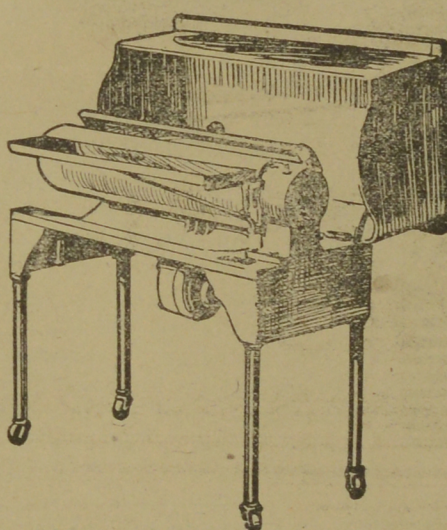
