

## NEW YORKERS WILL TRY FOR SPRING SALMON

Party of Distinguished Sportsmen Arrived by Special Train Yesterday En Route to Cain's River.

A distinguished party of New York sportsmen headed by Major W. O. McGeehan of the New York-Herald Tribune, arrived in the city at noon yesterday and registered at the Queen. They travelled from New York in a private car by way of Montreal and came in from Fredericton Junction on a special train placed at their disposal by the C. P. R. authorities. Yesterday afternoon several members of the party enjoyed a horse back ride about the city, while others paid a visit to the Experimental Station. This morning the party left by the Whooper for Cain's River where they will spend from a week to ten days fishing salmon under the guidance of Mr. W. Harry Allen of Peniac.

### Those in the Party.

Mayor McGeehan, who heads the party is sporting editor of the New York Herald-Tribune and a close personal friend of Gene Tunney, champion heavyweight pugilist of the world. This is his third or fourth fishing trip to Cain's River. Those accompanying him are: John Kelly, Marine Editor of the New York Herald-Tribune, Frank O'Brien moving picture operator; H. C. Stoneham, a son of Charles A. Stoneham, owner of the New York Giants; Gene Fowler, a star reporter of the International News Service; J. V. Gallagher of the Goodwin-Gallagher company, contractors, Capt. J. L. Bersnam of the New York police department and George Granpiers, proprietor of the El Dorado restaurant New York. The members of the party, six of whom are in their first fishing trip to New Brunswick are looking forward to a week of rare sport.

#### Forty Hours Ended.

#### Application Refused.

Mr. Justice White, of the Appeal Division of the Supreme Court, Friday afternoon heard an application by J. J. F. Winslow, K. C., for the release from the York county jail of a client of his, convicted and sentenced in Fredericton under the Intoxicating Liquor Act of 1927. The application was under habeas corpus. Mr. Justice White refused to grant an order to liberate the prisoner. Counsel stated that further application will be made to another judge of the Supreme Court in the matter.

#### Fires on Sunday

The fire department was called out to three small fires over the week-end, none of which proved serious. Early Saturday evening, a roof fire called out the department to the residence of Harold Rogers, on Needham st. Again on Sunday morning it was called to the home of George Jeffries on Aberdeen street, where another roof fire was in progress. The fire was rung in from box 12. About one o'clock yesterday afternoon, a grass fire occurred up near the Children's Home. The alarm being rung in from box 8. The fire was extinguished without any damage being done.

## TO TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION AGAINST FIRES

Those Entering the Woods After May 1st Must Take Out Permits.

A forerunner of the season when the forest fire hazard is critical in New Brunswick is the announcement of the Provincial Forest Service of the Department of Lands and Mines that May 1st, is the date on and after which forest travel certificates must be in possession of persons entering upon forest lands in this province.

Four hundred vendors have been authorized to issue these certificates, the province being completely blanketed with places where they may be issued so there can be no excuse for non-compliance with the provisions of section 42, chapter 32 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1927, and all persons should register with the fire warden nearest the woods, in which they desire to travel. The only exemptions are licensee of Crown Lands or owners of the land entered upon or by their employees, fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, holders of hunting, fishing, guides' or mining licenses, or

## HUDLIN TRIAL BEGUN THIS AFTERNOON

The Prisoners Arraigned Jointly Before Justice LeBlanc at the Sunbury Circuit Court

The trial of Nehemiah and Samuel Hudlin charged with the murder of Provincial Policeman Russell P. Hayward will begin this afternoon before Mr. Justice LeBlanc at the Sunbury Circuit and will likely occupy the remainder of the week. Attorney General Baxter will represent the Crown and P. J. Hughes, K. C., and F. H. Peters will appear for the defendants.

The prisoners were indicted by the grand jury last week and the petit jury panel was dismissed until today.

Attorney General Baxter arrived from Saint John by train this morning and soon afterwards set out by car for Burton in company with Commissioner Salt of the Provincial Police. A number of witnesses also went down by car including Dr. O. E. Morehouse, who conducted the post mortem on the body of Policeman Hayward.

Samuel Hudlin one of the prisoners, who spent the winter in the York
