

INSURANCE MEN IN CITY REGARD TO TARIFF RATES

H. M. Farmer and M. G. Haskings of St. John Will be Here For Two Weeks — Forming of New Tariff Boards.

H. M. Farmer and W. G. Haskings, who are connected with the Canadian Fire Underwriter's Association at St. John, arrived in the city on Monday from St. John and will spend two weeks in this city for the purpose of inspecting for a new tariff of rates. This inspection occurs every six or seven years and at these periods new tariff boards are formed. The two men are registered at the Queen Hotel.

New Rating Schedule

Besides this work the usual routine of a new rating schedule will be gone into, with the purpose of making New Brunswick the same as in the upper Canadian provinces. This is not the first time that the two young men have been to this city on similar business. A number of old friends in this city are renewing acquaintance with them.

Upon arriving yesterday Messrs Farmer and Haskings conferred with H. H. Blair, local insurance man, upon the business mentioned above. Probably no more than two weeks will be taken up with the business, according to one of the insurance men.

Commissioner Morgan said that the reports that the police had been assisted by soldiers was false. The residents in the country had rendered all the help to the police that they could but so far as the actual search was concerned it was conducted by the police alone.

PROVINCIAL POLICE GET TELEGRAM

Exact Wording of Telegram Commuting Albert De Merchant's Sentence to Life Imprisonment Received Here.

The exact wording of the telegram commuting the sentence of death to that of life imprisonment on Arthur DeMerchant was received by Provincial Police Headquarters here today. The telegram read:

"I am commanded to inform you that His Excellency, the Governor-General has had under consideration capital case of Arthur DeMerchant and is pleased to order a sentence of death passed upon DeMerchant to be commuted to a term of life imprisonment in Dorchester Penitentiary.

Please repeat back this telegram immediately after receipt, letter follows by today's mail.
