Annual N. B. Law Examinations Started This Morning in Parliament Buildings — One Less Than in 1927.

The examinations will conclude on Friday, and will consist of oral and written tests. The examinations are being conducted under the supervision of E. Allison McKay.

The four candidates taking the examinations are: George M. Macdonald, of Campbellton; Kenneth W. Palmer of Sackville, N. B.; Russell P. Sheldrick, St. John, a U. N. B. graduate; and M. Gerald Teed, of St. John. The board of examiners will be similar to last year composing J. J. P. Winslow, K. C., P. J. Hughes, K. C., and Ernest A. MacKay.

The number of candidates taking the Law Examinations this year is one less than in 1927, there having been five writing on this date last year.

MOST VALUABLE  
LEAGUE PLAYER

Member of Baseball Hunting Party Gets American League Award for 1928—Jubilant Over News of Selection.

Gordon (Mickey) Cochrane, catcher of the Philadelphia Athletics and one of the members of the party of major league baseball stars who have gone to Hopewell Lodge for two weeks big game hunting, received word this morning that he had been selected as the most valuable player to his club in the American League for 1928.

"That's just about the best news I have ever received", exclaimed Cochrane, when he got the word. The award carries with it a money prize of \$1,000, a fitting memorial and a place in baseball's hall of fame. Soon after the first word came telephone calls from newspapers in Philadelphia and other cities commenced arriving for Cochrane, but none of the calls reached him until the party got to Doaktown where they stopped for dinner.

A SPEAKER AT

Sir Herbert B. Ames, ex-M. P., of Montreal, formerly financial director of the League of Nations, was the speaker at the weekly luncheon of the Rotary Club at noon today. Sir Herbert is now making a tour of the Maritimes and yesterday spoke before the Canadian Club at Saint John. This morning he addressed the students of the University of New Brunswick on the League of Nations.

Dr. W. C. Kierstead, district governor, presided very acceptably at the Rotary Club luncheon at noon. Sir Herbert took for his theme, "Seven Years Experience of a World Treasurer" and dealt with it in a very able and interesting manner. In the course of his remarks he referred to Canada's connection with the League and declared that country has enjoyed the respect of every sovereign state. He referred to the great part that Can-
