

## MISSING HEIR ENTITLED SHARE \$30,000 ESTATE

**William Ray, Former Boston Man, Falls Heir to Share in Large Estate — Thought to be in N. B.**

William Ray, assumed to be residing somewhere in New Brunswick, is entitled to share in an estate which is worth \$30,000, according to word received from John J. Dwyer, New York Attorney, whose place of business is at 40 Wall Street. The letter states that the missing man, slated for an ample slice in this estate, is thought to be in this province, having come here a few years ago. Previous to his removing to New Brunswick, Ray lived in Boston, Mass., for a number of years.

No Word.

William Ray is the son of Hugh Ray and Elizabeth Graham, and was born near Donegal, Scotland. Outside of the fact given the writer of the letter is unable to give further information. Since the missing man has removed to this province, with his wife (he married a widow) nothing has been heard from him. ### Large Saturday Market

A large number of farmers were in the Phoenix Square market space this morning and weather conditions were favorable. Prices varied slightly from last week and eggs was the chief produce selling high; the price was 70 cents per dozen. A number were bought at this price but later in the morning the prices fell to 65 cents. There was a good quantity of pork on hand going for 15 and 18 cents. The prices were as follows: apples, \$2 to \$7; carrots \$2 per barrel; eggs, 70 cents per dozen; butter 40 and 42 cents per pound; pork 15 and 18 cents; lamb 18 cents; chicken 40 cents per lb; potatoes \$1.25 per barrel; turnips \$1 per barrel.

## FINAL MEMBER FLOUR QUARTET TAKEN BY POLICE

**Percy MacHatton Arrested at Wakefield Yesterday by Constable Wilson — Remanded Till Tuesday.**

Percy MacHatton, the last of the three youths, who are charged with being connected with the robbery of Thomas M. Brewer's store at Hawshaw on October the 17th., was rearrested yesterday at his home in Lower Wakefield by Provincial Police constable Wilson, of the Woodstock detachment and brought to this city and lodged in the city police station. When he appeared before the police magistrate this morning, he was remanded until Tuesday 27th., when he will be heard, along with Eldon Saunders, and Ernest Stairs in the preliminary hearing of the reopening of the Hawshaw robbery case of October 17.

Jesse Serving Term.

Jesse Stairs, the fourth member of the quartet, was convicted in the York County court in October and is now serving a two months sentence in the York County jail. It was the involved evidence of the latter in the Devco police court before Magistrate Haines. (Continued on page five)

## MONAHAN WAS ALLOWED APPEAL IN LIQUOR CASE

**Magistrate Had No Jurisdiction to Try Case—Had Been Twice Appealed—Followed Nova Scotia Move.**

The appeal of Hugh Monahan, St. Stephen man, from the conviction of Magistrate Limerick under the Customs and Excise Act following the seizure of a large liquor manufacturing plant near Lake George a year ago, has been allowed by the Appeal division of the Supreme Court, before which the case has been heard and which was settled yesterday. An error was made yesterday in publication when it was stated that Monahan's appeal was refused. The judgment of the court, as given by Chief Justice Hazen, was that the rule had been made absolute to quash the conviction of the police magistrate. The effect of the decision is that any person unlawfully manufacturing liquor contrary to the Excise Act can only be tried by a jury or the Exchequer Court of Canada.

Full Term and Fine.

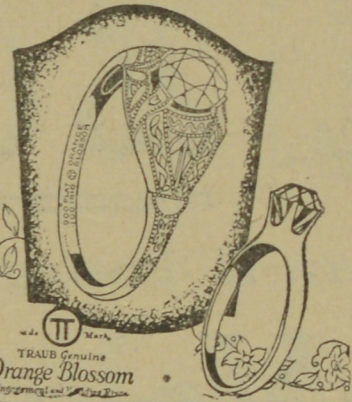
