KING NEBUCHAANEZZAR WAS THE FIRST ROAD BUILDER

Research has recently disclosed the fact that Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon, 694 B. C., was the first to build paved thoroughfares. Nebuchadnezzar built his "Procession Street," of asphalt, beginning at the Tower of Isthar Gate, and dedicated it to his beloved gods. Nabu and Maruk, and the memory of Nabopolassar, his father. An ornament on the wall of the tower, still existent, represents Sirrush, the fantastic companion of the god Marduk.

As a cementing medium or mortar, asphalt had been used as far back as the time of the ancient Sumarians. about 2500 B. C., but it remained for discoveries recently made in the asphalt beds of Carpenteria, in Santa Barbara County, Californa, to disclose that the material used by the Samarians and by Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon, and now used on the streets and roads of America, must have been formed more than 100,000 years ago, while the eastern part of this country was buried under the great glacial ice sheet. Sealed for agas in these beds of asphalt have been found lately the bones of mastodon, sabortoothed tiger and other mammals that inhabited the United States at that time. As these bones are brought to light they are being deposited in the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural

There have already been found bones of deer, horses, rabbits and skunks. Beasts of prey were represented by three species of the foxwolf group. There were fifteen species of birds, including a kind of wild peacock, a species of duck and a pair of very modern crows. There were twenty-eight specimens of one kind of eagle, fifteen of hawks, and several of owls, vultures and con like birds.. Among the latter was one giant, known as Tereatemis, which was at least as large as the modern condors, the largest birds that fly.

The usually accepted theory is that herbivorous animals trying to cross the asphalt beds were entangled and killed, and that the wredatory anim ils and birds coming to feast on their bodies, were in turn caught. In addition to the animal bones that have been found many pieces of wood, pine cones, and other plant remains. The outstanding trees are two species of pine and two of cypress. Specimens of both of the pines and one of the cypresses have been found embedded


