

COCOANUT SOUFFLE PIE AT SUNSET

3 egg yolks

1-4 cup sugar

1-4 teaspoon salt

1 cup hot milk 1 cup cocoanut

1-8 teaspoon each lemon and almond extract

3 egg whites

Beat egg yolks and add sugar, salt and hot milk. Cook in double boiler until mixture thickens. Cool slightly and add three quarters cup cocoanut. Add flavoring and fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into baked crust and sprinkle remainder cocoanut over top. Bake in moderate oven about 30 minutes or until puffed and firm.
