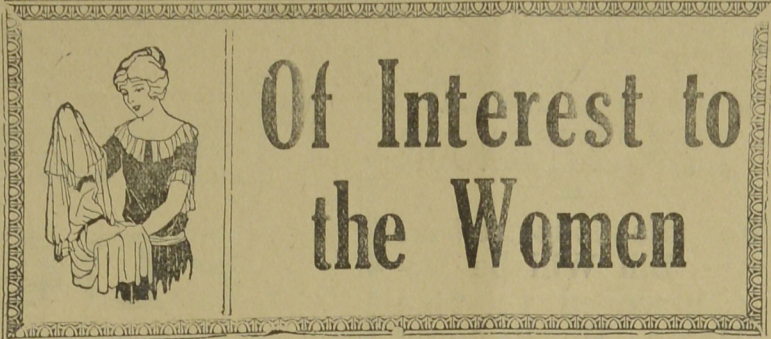
C. N. R. GIVES OUT A STATEMENT IN REGARD TO THE HOTEL SITUATION IN HALIFAX, N. S.

Montreal, Que., March 28—The following official statement on Halifax Hotel situations was issued at the Canadian National headquarters today.

In 1926 a plan which had been privately promoted for the erection of a modern hotel at Halifax was presented to the Board of Directors of the Canadian National Railways for consideration. The plan proposed was found to be unsatisfactory in its method of finance and was rejected. The need of more modern hotel facilities at Halifax was, however, apparent to the Board, and it was recognized that with the establishment in the winter of 1928-1929 of the new and important services of the Canadian National steamships between Halifax and the West Indies, this need would become still more pressing. Protracted negotiations ensued between Halifax financiers and the National Railways in an effort to arrive at a satisfactory plan whereby the National Railways might participate in the promoters' undertaking, although the inclination of the board was that the railway should construct and own its own hotel at Halifax. After negotiations had been in progress for some time, the Canadian Pacific Railway was invited by the promoters to participate in the enterprise, but no decision was reached by the board of that company until September 26, 1927, when the Canadian Pacific decided to take up \$350,000 of the preferred stock of the hotel enterprise. More than two months prior to this action by the Canadian Pacific—on July 14, 1927—Col. J. L. Ralston, Minister of National Defence, had announced that the possibility of the Canadian National Railways participating financially in the building of a hotel by Halifax promoters had been considered by the cabinet and that approval would not be forthcoming for the purchase by the C. N. R. of minority shares in a privately financed hotel without the direct authority of Parliament. On July 20, 1927, the Canadian National announced that an approximate amount would be included in the annual railway budget to be submitted to Parliament for the provision of hotel facilities at Halifax. On September 23, 1927, further representations that the Canadian National Railways should purchase preferred shares in the privately promoted Halifax hotel were considered by the cabinet, and Col. Ralston notified the president of the hotel company, immediately, that the cabinet had adhered to the decision reached on July 14th and emphasized the announcement of the Canadian National management to include in the provisions for 1928, a railway terminal hotel at Halifax. The decision of the Canadian Pacific to take up the preferred stock of the hotel company was made by the Executive Committee of that railway three days later.

The new combined station and hotel of the Canadian National Railways at Halifax, upon which foundation work is proceeding, is admirably situated to serve the transportation needs of the community, being on the ocean terminals, and immediately adjoining the present station site of the National System. Ample land was available without additional cost. The hotel is to have one hundred and sixty rooms with ultimate capacity of three hundred rooms. Authority is asked in the railway estimates to be tabled in the House of Commons this week for the expenditure of \$1,250,000 and the Board of the Canadian National Railways believes that it has acted with wisdom and followed that course which was essential for the protection of the company's interests.

COCOANUT SOUFFLE PIE

3 egg yolks
1-4 cup sugar
1-4 teaspoon salt
1 cup hot milk
1 cup cocoanut
1-8 teaspoon each lemon and almond extract
3 egg whites
Beat egg yolks and add sugar, salt and hot milk. Cook in double boiler until mixture thickens. Cool slightly and add three quarters cup cocoanut. Add flavoring and fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into baked crust and sprinkle remainder of cocoanut over top. Bake in moderate oven about 30 minutes or until puffed and firm.

FRUIT PUNCH.

3 tablespoons tea
6 lemons
2 oranges
4 cups sugar
1 pt. grated pineapple
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon almond
1 pt. ginger ale
3 quarts water
Put in saucepan and cover with 1 quart boiling water. Cover tightly for 5 minutes, strain. Grate rinds of half the lemons and oranges. Add this with sugar to strained tea. Place on fire and bring to boil and let boil 5 minutes. Strain and cool then add the juice of the lemons and oranges to the rest of the ingredients.

RHUBARB OMELET

Beat five eggs well, add a heaping teaspoon of sugar, the grated rind of one lemon and a few gratings of nutmeg and cook until set. Have ready three tablespoons of cooked rhubarb well sweetened and mix with one tablespoon whipped cream. Put in the centre of the omelet, roll and turn out in a heated dish. Any fruit such as peaches or apricots may be used in the same way for a fruit omelet.

FROZEN MARSHMALLOW PUD- DING.

1 1-2 cups orange juice
1-4 cup lemon juice
12 marshmallows
1-2 cup chopped walnut meats
1 1-4 cups powdered sugar
4 tablespoons water
1 cup heavy cream
1-4 teaspoon vanilla
Put marshmallows, cut small, powdered sugar and water in double boiler and beat until marshmallows lose their shape and become soft. Cool. Whip the cream and combine the two mixtures, adding vanilla and nuts. Mix other ingredients and pour into mold, cover with marshmallow and cream mixture cover with buttered paper fit on cover and pack mold in ice and salt for three hours.

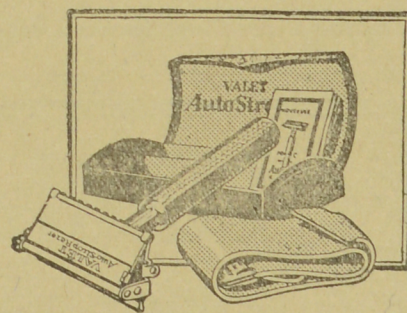


