

## MODERN WOMEN STRANGE LOT, SAYS MISS FARRAR

New York, May 10—Geraldine Farrar, as beautiful in maturity as she was in youth, when first, she flashed the horizon of grand opera, finds modern women, who seek the fountain of youth, "a strange lot."

### Cites Beauty of Spirit

Starting with the unalterable truth that "you cannot stave off age," she argues that the beauty of age is as entrancing, in its own scope, as the beauty of youth. It is beauty of spirit and intellect that proves captivating in maturity, she says, and his spirit is ageless.

"It is only fear that makes a woman cling to the vestiges of youth long after it has fled," said the prima dona. "Women who are lovely in youth and have been admired by every one feel that only physical beauty has earned them these tributes. They do not realize that beauty of spirit and of intellect are ageless and never cease to attract and hold others."

"You can't stave off age. At 40 one is only a mask of one's former self. You can't compress yourself at 45 into the mold you fitted at 20. If you spend all your time trying to retain physical youth and beauty, you have no time to cultivate the generosity of spirit and intellect which must sweeten middle age."

"Years spent in clutching at youth leave one bitter at the futility of the task and bored at the prospect of the years ahead. You cannot radiate yourself, you have nothing to give to others if your ambition is to be ever young. We're all dependent on each other and we must have something to give to others if any of us are to be happy."

"To me the years are not periods of 365 days. The years to me are only an accumulation of colors which

I may use to work out the patterns in the tapestry of my life. The years are only an accumulation of sorrows and joys that can mold and guide me for the future."

"Modern women are a strange lot to me. Physically, I mean. They have become standardized. It seems to me that women have gone crazy. I never can eat with my women friends and more because I like to eat and they don't dare to. If they were to swallow two olives, they'd ruin the silhouettes figures of which they're so proud."

"They cling to youth and dread maturity. Yet I know that all the concentrated love and loyalty of years attends a fine maturity."

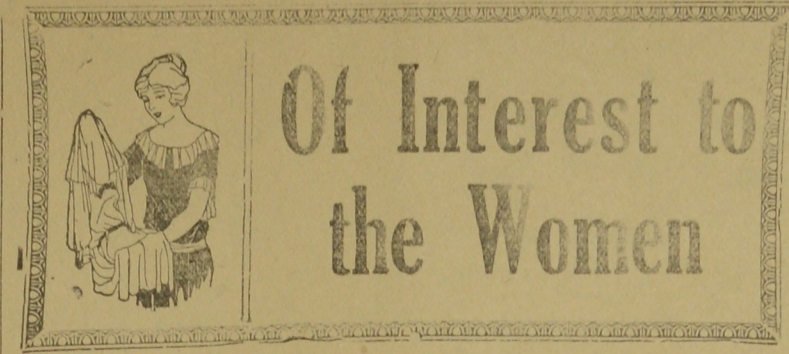

## Of Interest to the Women

### HOUSEHOLD SUGGESTIONS

A pinch of salt will keep "mother" from forming on the top of vinegar.

A cloth dampened in kerosene is efficacious in cleaning linoleum, tiles, all kinds of porcelain and the stove.

Never use soap on hair brushes dip the bristles up and down in hot ammonia water. Rinse and dry with bristles down.

If cooking a cheap piece of meat rub the dish with garlic and you will find the meat much more tasty and delectable.

Slices of ham, covered with little mounds of spinach with sliced hard boiled eggs on top are as tasty as they are attractive.

To keep pimientos from spoiling when you need only part of a can heat the rest to the boiling point and seal in a glass jar.

When washing blankets, shake first, then plunge into warm suds and wash. Hang on line, stretching firmly, and rinse with the garden hose.

Left over cooked breakfast food makes a delicious baked pudding when mixed with one egg, covered with milk and seasoned with sugar vanilla and raisin.

Open sandwiches are being served frequently right now. Chopped eggs mixed with a little onion, Roquefort cheese and cream make delicious sandwiches.

### QUICK PLAIN CAKE

1 cup sugar  
1 1/2 cups flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup melted shortening  
2 eggs  
Milk  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Mix sugar, flour, baking powder and salt together. Sift 2 or 3 times. Put shortening in measuring cup, add eggs and fill cup with milk. Add liquid to the sifted flour mixture. Add vanilla and beat thoroughly. Bake in 2 greased layer cake pans in a hot oven, 400 deg. F., 15 to 20 minutes. Cool. Put layers together and ice top with Quick Frosting. This cake may also be baked in greased muffin pans.

### SPONGE CAKE

5 eggs  
1 cup granulated sugar  
1/2 lemon (grated rind and juice)  
1 cup cake flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
Separate the eggs; beat the yolks until light colored and thick. Add the sugar gradually and beat well. Add lemon juice and rind; fold in the flour, which has been sifted with the salt. Last, cut and fold in the beaten egg whites. Pour into an ungreased sponge cake pan and bake for one hour in oven at 325 to 350 degrees (F.).

1 cup sugar  
1/4 cup water  
1 egg white  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
Put sugar, water and unbeaten egg white in saucepan and cook over boiling water. Beat constantly until frosting is the proper consistency to spread. Add vanilla.  
After measuring the ingredients it only takes two minutes for making.

### SPONGE CAKE

2 eggs  
1 cup sugar  
1 cup flour  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
1/4 cup cold water  
Salt  
Break the eggs into a bowl, add the sugar, and beat together 10 minutes. Add the dry ingredients which have been sifted together and the cold water. Bake in a moderate oven 40 minutes.

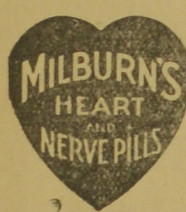

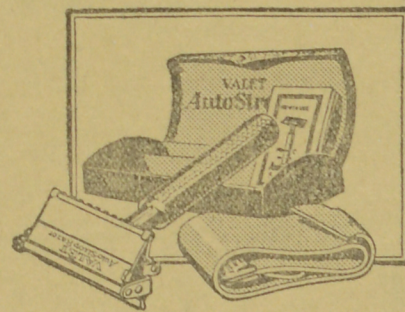
