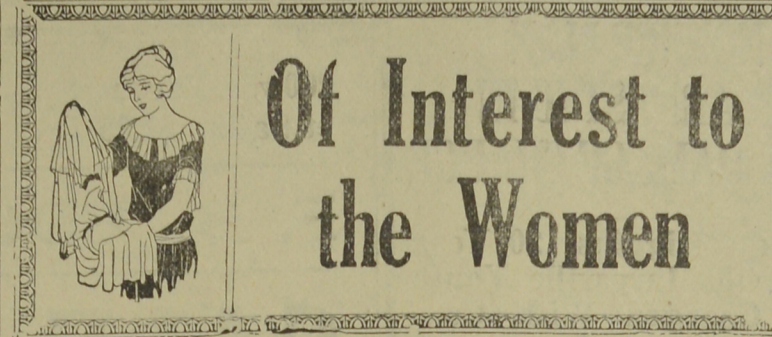

CHEESE JELLY RING

- 2 cups milk
- 2 egg yolks
- 1-2 pound cheese
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1-2 teaspoon salt
- 1-2 teaspoon paprika
- 1 tablespoon gelatin
- 2 tablespoons cold water

Press cheese through a coarse strainer. Soak gelatin in water. Scald the milk and add a little of it to the beaten egg yolks. When well mixed stir into hot milk. Mix seasoning and add and stir mixture until it just begins to thicken. Add cheese and gelatin and stir until the mixture is smooth. Pour into a ring mold to chill and set. This will make about ten servings.

TOMATO JELLY

- 2 cans tomato soup
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1-2 tablespoons gelatin
- 1-4 cup cold water
- 10 to 12 stuffed olives

Heat the soup with boiling water. Soften gelatin in cold water, add to soup and stir until dissolved. Arrange olives in bottom of mold and pour in carefully enough hot mixture to just cover bottom of mold. Set in refrigerator or ice water to harden and when set pour in the rest of the mixture and chill until set. Unmold on a platter and fill center with a mixed vegetable salad. Surround with lettuce and pieces of sliced lemon piled with mayonnaise and sprinkled with minced parsley or celery.

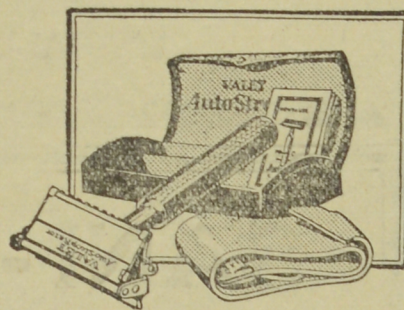
