

CLARENCE SMITH  
SERIOUSLY HURT  
IN AUTO CRASH

Nashwaak Village Youth Sustained Serious Injuries When he Was Struck by Auto—Was on Bicycle.

An accident which may result in the death of Clarence Smith, 21 year old son of Mr. Warren Smith of Nashwaak Village, occurred last evening near the young man's home, when he was hit by a passing motorist while travelling homeward on his bicycle. The car was driven by Frank Boone of Devon and the driver of the bicycle was struck by the full force of the machine as it went to go by him on the road. When picked up the boy was in an unconscious condition and he was immediately rushed to the Victoria Public Hospital in this city. The accident victim was badly gashed about the face and sustained a long cut along the top of his head.

Report today from the hospital is to the effect that the young man is in a very serious condition as the result of the wounds received. Relatives of the boy are anxiously awaiting news of his condition.

Struck Head on.

According to an eye witness the accident was unavoidable. The victim of the accident was proceeding toward his home in the Village and was pedalling in a rather careless manner. He was on the wrong side of the road and did not hear the approach of a car from behind. The boy looked up when the car driven by Mr. Boone was directly back of him. He then made a quick turn to get on his right side, but the car, also attempting to steer clear of the boy, crashed directly into him, knocking him from his wheel and striking him on the head as he fell.

The injured man was rushed quickly into an automobile and brought to this city where his wounds were attended to. The injuries sustained show the boy to be in a very serious condition.

SAYS CARIBOU  
NOT RETURNING  
TO THE PROVINCE

Arthur Pringle, Veteran Guide, Says There is No Truth in Report Published by N. Y. Sporting Journal.

Mr. Arthur Pringle of Stanley, the dean of New Brunswick guides, who came to the city today to pay a last tribute to his old friend, the late Mr. Charles Cremin, gave an emphatic denial to a report published in the current number of Forest and Stream that caribou were returning to New Brunswick. The article in question which was contributed by a Saint John man, reports Guide William Buckley as having quite recently seen a herd of caribou at Scotch Lake, York County. It also states that herds have recently been seen in the Miramichi district.

Did Not Migrate.

Mr. Pringle stated emphatically that it was over three years since a caribou had been seen at Bald Mountain whereas twenty and twenty-five years ago they could be counted by the hundreds. "The caribou are not returning to New Brunswick", said Mr.

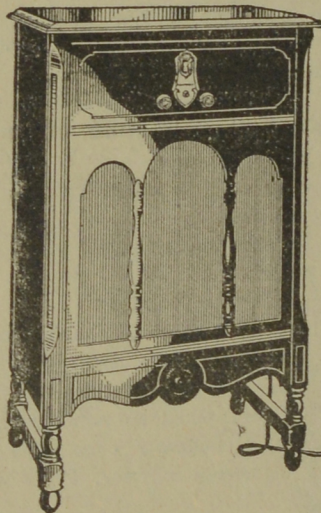
