PAST TWO WEEKS

Colder Weather and the Presence of Snow on Main Roads Causing a Lull—Few Seizures Made Recently.

The final activities of the New Brunswick illegal transporters of contraband liquor probably have been conducted within the past few days, when goods to the amount of \$11,000 were seized near Woodstock several days ago by Customs officers of that place. With the arrival of the deep snow, the officials now expect a falling off in bootlegging operations throughout the province. The fact that two automobiles one a Buick, were taken near Woodstock by the customs officers due to the smugglers forsaking their cars in the deep snow would point to a probable lull in this illegal smuggling.

Cold Weather a Halt.
There have been no seizures of alcohol to any extent by the local Provincial Police officials lately which indicates further to the decrease in operations. With the coming of more snow and colder weather the participants in this illegal traffic of liquor are beginning to make use of the railroads in an attempt to get their supplies over the border. At Newcastle recently a trunk full of this contraband was discovered on the maritime express and seized.

NON-RESIDENT ANGLERS AND
BIG GAME HUNTERS A GREAT
HELP TO TRADE OF FREDERICTON

Estimated That at Least \$50,000 Was Expended Last Year by This Class of Visitors—Salmon Angling is Now the Big Attraction For Non-Residents.

Fredericton as the chief outfitting point in the province has had many visiting sportsmen during the past season and the amount of money which they left with guides, outfitters, hotel keepers and garages undoubtedly amounted to a respectable sum. Some of those in a position to form an opinion as to the actual expenditure place it as high as fifty-thousand dollars. Fredericton is not now visited by as many non-resident big game hunters as was the case twenty or twenty-five years ago but the shortage is more than made up by the increased number of visiting anglers. Big game, especially moose are not as plentiful in the Miramichi Country as they used to be and since the advent of the auto, sportsmen are not quite so keen on long tramps into the woods as was formerly the case. The car has not yet been devised, if we except the tractor, that can negotiate a Miramichi tote road and this being so, hunters are now inclined to favor localities where they stand a chance of knocking

Many Anglers Came
Fredericton has seen a surprising increase in the number of visiting anglers during the past three years, and there is sure to be a further increase as the attractions of this section of the province become better known. The Saint John River, the Southwest Miramichi, Cain's River and the Nashwaak all had their quota of non-resident anglers during the season which closed on September 30th. Cain's River which is under lease to Mr. W. Harry Allen had by far the largest number, no

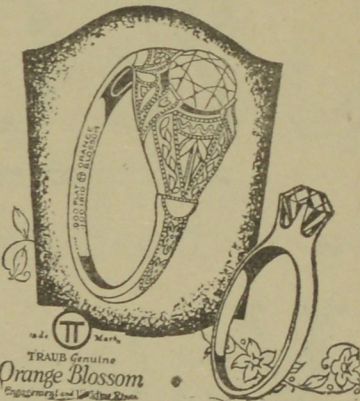

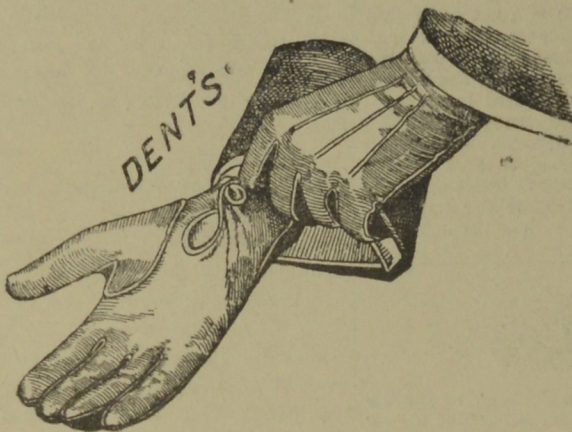
