WAS DECISION
IN LIQUOR CASE

Springhill Hotel Proprietor Fined \$200 and Costs With One Month in Jail If Default in Payment.

\$200 and costs with a one month's term in the York county jail in default of payment was the judgment handed down by Magistrate Limerick this morning in the case of the King vs. John Doherty, who was charged with keeping liquor for sale at his hotel or boarding house at Springhill. J. J. F. Winslow, K. C., counsel for the defendant gave no notice of appeal. C. L. Dougherty of the firm of Hanson, Dougherty & West was the prosecuting attorney.

Liquor Seized.

The case arose out of the seizure of some liquor at the defendant's premises by Sergeant John Bird of the Provincial Police some time ago. Under the terms of the Liquor Act such keeping of liquor for sale was forbidden but counsel for the defence argued that the premises of the defendant Mr. Doherty constituted a boarding house and as such did not come under the provisions of the Liquor Act as regards hotels and the sale of liquor. The question naturally arose as to whether the term boarding house and hotel were synonymous in the wording of the act. The case has been set over several times.

TAX RETURNS ARE
BETTER THAN IN
PREVIOUS YEARS

Crowds of Ratepayers Throng Treasurer's Office Yesterday — Final Day For Discount--Waited in Line

The City Treasurer's office was bombarded yesterday by the incessant rush of ratepayers of the city of Fredericton to pay their taxes and receive the benefit of the 5 per cent discount which accompanies the paying of taxes before a certain period each year. \$71,000 was taken into the treasury in the final rush yesterday, marking the last day to receive the coveted discount. More than half of this year's assessment has been already received. Statistics from the city treasurer show that of the \$267,000 assessed \$190,000 is now in the treasury. This is considerably better than last year at the same period.

Larger Than Usual.

Only \$15,000 of this amount was accumulated in June and the present busy month has netted the vast remainder. In the two days previous to yesterday, \$50,000 was taken in, which with yesterday's record breaking (Continued From Page Five.)

WAS KNOCKED OFF
AUTO MOVING AT
60 MILES AN HOUR

Provincial Police Looking For Sheldon Greene Who Pushed Customs Officer From His Car—Liquor Violator Caught.

Provincial Police in the North of the province are looking for a man called Sheldon Greene who, when accused of smuggling goods into Canada from the United States by a Canadian Customs officer, drove off with the officer on the running board and struck him knocking him off the car when travelling at a rate of sixty miles an hour, according to a report received from Andover by police headquarters here today.

Smuggled Goods

Greene was stopped at the Custom House by Custom Officer Loose, Saturday. He was told that he had smuggled goods in the car. This he denied and drove off with Loose clinging to the running board of the car. When they had reached a speed of a mile a minute about two miles out of Andover, Greene struck Loose in the face knocking him from the car. Loose was badly hurt. So far (Continued on Page Five)
