Heeney proved entirely too much for what Sharkey had to offer and there were many in the crowd at Madison Square Garden who would have awarded the fight to the New Zealander on points.

Certainly the stout hearted fighting man from down below the equator carried the battle to the ex-gob from Boston from the opening bell.

The very first punch of the bout nearly ended matters, for Heeney, coming out of his corner with a rush, connected with a straight right to Sharkey's jaw. Jack blinked, and most of the fight went out of his blue eyes. He could outbox Heeney, but he couldn't outfight him.

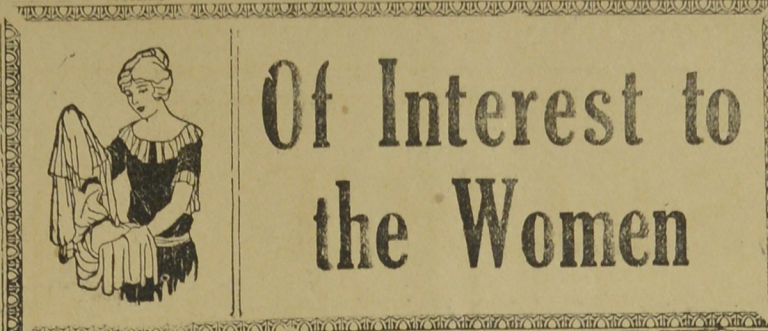

Blue in Detroit as in New York is the predominating color. Aquamarine, Lake, Navy and Baby are the shade which it is believed will find most favor here.

### PEACH SHORTCAKE.

2 cups flour  
2 rounded or 4 level teaspoons baking powder  
1-2 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons shortening  
Milk  
Small can sliced peaches

Sift the flour, baking powder and salt into bowl; add the shortening and rub in very lightly with the tips of the fingers; add cold milk enough to hold together. Dust pie plate with flour and pat the dough about one inch thick; brush top with cold milk and bake 25 minutes in hot oven. Split the cake and cover with sliced peaches. Dust the top with sugar and serve warm with milk or peach syrup.

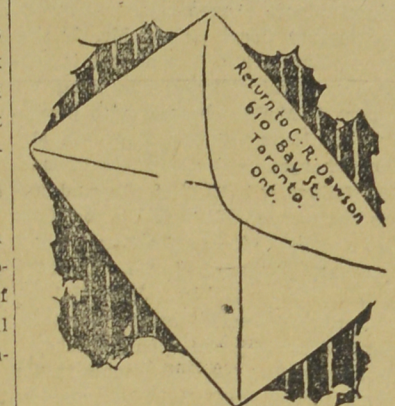

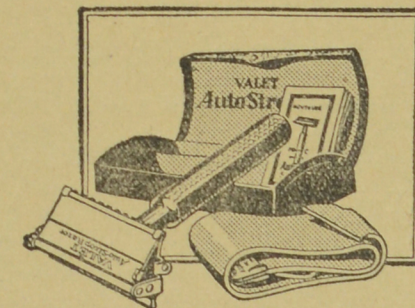
