New York, Oct. 3—Dazzy Vance is going to graduate from the maiden ranks where world series games are concerned tomorrow afternoon.

After throwing his fast one past National League batters for the past seven years the speed ball king of the Brooklyn Robins is going to see what the fall classic is all about.

Vance threatened that he would not see a world series game until he pitched in one, after the Giants nosed out the Robins in 1924 but Dazzy has been overcome by curiosity and will be among the 75,000 odd present when Miller Huggins' interesting invalids face the Cardinals in the Yankee stadium.



Of Interest to the Women

TOMATO AND PINEAPPLE SALAD

6 tomatoes
1 cup sliced pineapple
1 cup mayonnaise
Select smooth, uniform medium-sized tomatoes. Cut off the top and scoop out the centre, making a cup. Mix the diced celery the pineapple and diced tomatoes with the mayonnaise. Fill the tomato cups with the mixture and serve on a lettuce leaf.

STUFFED CAULIFLOWER

Take a whole head of tender cauliflower. Parboil. Make a bread stuffing season to taste. Cheese may be added if desired. Place dressing between the flowerlets of the cauliflower and bake in moderate oven nicely browned.

CARROT AND PEANUT SALAD

1 1-2 cups chopped cabbage
1-2 cup chopped peanuts
1 cup grated carrots
1-2 cup finely chopped sweet peppers
Mayonnaise
Mix all the ingredients together. Serve on lettuce leaves.

CALIFORNIA LIMA SALAD

Toss together lightly two cups of cooked lima beans two cups of sliced cabbage two thirds of chopped pickles and two thirds cut of cheese cubes. Season to taste. All ingredients should be very cold.
Serve on crisp lettuce leaves with boiled dressing or mayonnaise.

ASPARAGUS RAREBIT

Cover each slice of buttered toast with a layer of cooked asparagus cut in inch pieces. Sprinkle the asparagus with salt and cayenne and a dash of Worcestershire sauce and cover this with a thick layer of grated American cheese. Place in the oven or under the broiler a few moments to melt but not brown the cheese. Serve immediately with a poached egg in the centre of each portion.

TOMATO AND OLIVE RAREBIT

2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons flour
1 cup thin cream
3-4 cup tomato juice
1-8 teaspoon soda
2 eggs
2 cups American cheese
1-2 cup stuffed olives
One third teaspoon salt
1-8 teaspoon powdered mustard
Pepper to taste
Melt the butter add flour, slowly then the cream and heat to the boiling point, stirring constantly; add the tomato juice and soda mixed. Cook for a few minutes then add the cheese cut in small pieces the eggs slightly beaten the olives and the seasonings. Cook slowly until the cheese has melted. Serve on toast.

MACAROONS

1 cup almond paste
1 cup powdered sugar
3 egg whites
Mix almond paste and sugar until it is like meal. Add one egg white at a time and mix thoroughly. When well blanched shape on oiled cookie sheets. Bake until well dried and brown using slow oven.

STOCKS MUST BE DEPOSITED BY OCTOBER 20

Eighty-six per cent. of the 7 per cent Preferred Stock and 87 per cent. of the Common Stock of International Paper Company have been deposited under the plan for the formation of International Paper and Power Company. The plan has accordingly been declared operative.

Stockholders who have not yet deposited their stock are being notified by the Committee that they have until the close of business October 20 to do so. The Committee is urging these stockholders to deposit their stock immediately and expresses its belief that the consummation of the plan, and the exchange of shares in International Paper Company for shares in International Paper and Power Company, will be advantageous not only to the business of the International Paper Company system as a whole, but to each class of stockholders making the exchange. The Committee consists of the following: Frank N. B. Close, Archibald R. Graustein, John R. Macomber, John W. McConnell, John S. Phipps, Albert H. Wiggin, and Owen D. Young. International Paper and Power Company will act as a holding company for the properties now owned and controlled by International Paper Company and it is expected to hold a very large majority of the common stock of New England Power Association.

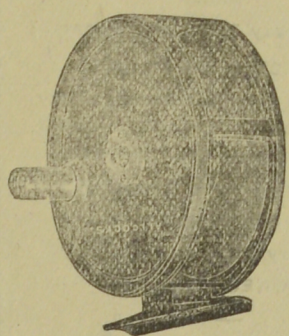
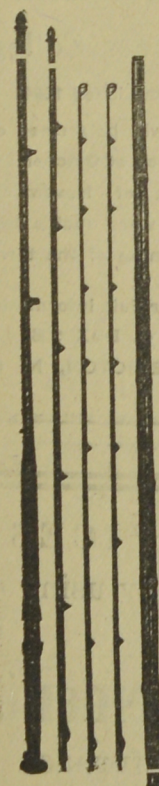

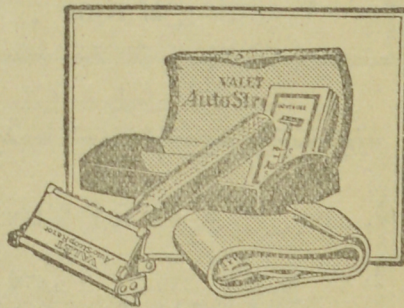
