

### NIGHT SCHOOL OPENING HAS 171 OF ENROLLMENT

**Vocational Evening  
Classes Opened at the  
High School—Record  
Enrollment—French  
Added.**

The fall term of the Vocational Committee's free evening classes began last night at High School with a record enrollment of 171 and the possibility of considerable more enrolling in the near future. Last year the enrollment was 159 and increase this year proves that these classes are becoming more and more popular. B. B. Barnes as usual will be in charge of these night classes and the teaching staff this year is nearly similar to last year. R. D. Hanson, secretary of the school board stated today that all classes are full and the expectation is that before the term is completed there will be a larger enrollment than ever before.

French Added

The subjects taught this year will be as they were last year with an additional one added. A class for French has been established this year and will be under the instruction of Mrs. J. L. Neville who is a very competent instructress. Already there is an enrollment of 30 in this class.

### SAXBY GALE VISITED HERE 59 YEARS AGO

**Today is Anniversary of  
the Terrible Atlantic  
Coast storm—Old Tim  
ers Recall Damage  
Wrought Here.**

Fifty-nine years ago today the eastern coast of North America was visited by one of the worst storms ever experienced in this part of the continent. A number of the older citizens of Fredericton will recollect the terror caused by this Saxby Gale, for this was the name by which it is familiarly known. The city of Fredericton suffered considerably by this storm catastrophe. The high tides accompanied by the exceedingly heavy gales wrought immeasurable damage to trees, buildings, and private residences throughout this district and there was no little loss of life. Farm lands were flooded by the tides and acres and acres of farm property wantonly destroyed by the force of the gale and it was a considerable period before affairs were righted and straightened out.

Those older persons who went through the storm will recall a warn-

Beautiful weather prevailed and they had a very enjoyable outing, but unfortunately ducks were scarce, the total bag of the party being only two brace.

The Governor General's train of six cars was parked on Wednesday evening in the C. N. R. siding at Oromocto and remained there until last evening, being a source of considerable interest to residents of the locality. His Excellency and his staff was astir long before day break yesterday morning and at six o'clock were joined by their guides, Messrs. Raymond Currie, Thomas Davidson and Edgar C. 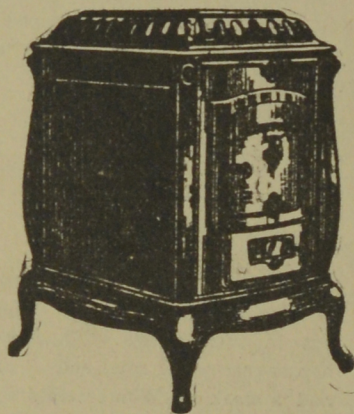
