

TRUNK ROADS IN THIS DISTRICT REOPEN TUESDAY

Motorists Can Use All Except Road to Oromocto — Quick Work Done in Repairing Kingsclear Bridges.

The trunk highways of the Fredericton district which have been closed for several weeks while the frost was coming out of the ground will with one exception be re-opened for traffic tomorrow. The exception is the highway leading from Fredericton to Oromocto which suffered damage during the rainstorm of last week. This highway will be reopened just as soon as the necessary repairs can be made. Of course the main highway along the Nashua river from Marysville to the Killarney road has not been open for traffic since last spring as it is being rebuilt under contract. The work will be completed some time during the coming summer. For the present the Killarney road will remain closed for motor traffic. The highway on the eastern side of the river will be opened as far as McGowan's.

Bridges Rebuilt.

The Long's Creek and Kelly's Creek bridges at Kingsclear, two of four structures carried away by ice have been partially rebuilt and are now open for traffic. Work on the McNally and Jewett bridges is well advanced and cars will be able to cross in a short time. It is just three weeks since these bridges were carried away so it will be seen that the Department of Public Works has lost no time in its efforts to restore the service to the public. With the exception of the Jewett bridge the main trunk highway from Fredericton to Woodstock is now open for traffic.

Deputy Minister Byron Kinghorn stated at noon today that the other roads in central New Brunswick would be opened for traffic just as soon as conditions warranted.

He added that the trunk road leading from Woodstock to Houlton was not yet open for motor traffic.

Water in the Main River Came up Over Two Feet During the Week End—Drives Making Progress.

CONDITIONS OFF-FT N. N. N. N. The heavy rain of Saturday has caused quite a sharp rise of water in the river and streams and has greatly improved driving conditions in central New Brunswick. It rained steadily during Saturday and continued for part of the night. There was also considerable rain during yesterday.

A two foot rise of water in the river here indicates that there was a good rainfall in the northern section of the province. The week end rise of water has caused much of the broken ice which has been piled along the shores for the past week to disappear.
