

OPERATIONS IN
LUMBER WOODS
HAVE STARTED

Northern Parts Have
Already Commenced
Logging— Prediction
of Average Cut Has
Been Made.

With the coming of the fall season, comes plans for the resumption of operations in the lumber woods and the report is that conditions this year will be as successful as in other years, or at least average. According to reports from the northern parts of the province conditions are very favorable. Logging operations began there several weeks ago. The lumbering magnates in the central portions are already beginning to prepare for the season and have sent men in to the woods.

With the heavy fall of rain this morning in this city, accompanied by a high wind, begins the usual October storms. The only benefit of the rain will probably be the advantage it affords the hunter. If rains continue it will enable the sportsmen to get a much better view of their quarry due to the leaves being washed and blown from the trees and will also give him a greater chance of creeping up on the unsuspecting moose or deer, due to the dampening influence of the rain on the dry leaves.

Nature hereabouts is beginning to present a very dilapidated appearance by reason of the cold fall weather and the heavy wind and rain of last evening and this morning. Though the weather has been of the finest since the opening of the month of October, this morning's wind and rain wrought havoc with the trees, inasmuch as the leaves fell in large quantities, covering up the ground and giving the trees a very desolate look.

DEATH OF HARRY
DAD VAIL FELT
KEENLY ALL OVER

One of Greatest Rowing
Coaches of All Time
Died at Gagetown on
Monday —Beloved of
Everyone.

Word of the death of Harry E. Vail, familiarly known as "Dad" Vail by his army of rowing fans in this country and United States, has caused a sadness in the hearts of many in this district who were personally acquainted with him. Dad Vail who was conceded by experts to be one of the greatest rowing coaches of all time, died at his summer home in Gagetown, N. B., on Monday morning, following a paralytic stroke. The deceased was a native of Gagetown having been born there 68 years ago. Since 1911 he has been the celebrated and popular coach of the Wisconsin University rowing squad and as such has stamped his name indelibly as one of the greatest coaches in the country.

Faultless Reputation.
The deceased was born at Gagetown N. B. 68 years ago and was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Elias Vail. He had been engaged in the rowing pro (Continued on page five.)
