

Canada also Hit

Saskatoon, Sask., reported a threatened repetition of last week's flood in the Pike Lake valley, 20 miles southwest, with the breaking up of a 12mile ice-jam which caused the first flood and two smaller ice jam's forming and the waters of the Saskatchewan River rising.

Southwest storm warnings were ordered along the coast north from San Francisco today. Heavy rains were causing the Coquille River in Oregon and its tributaries to rise, menacing lowlands and flooding highways and railroad tracks. Train service south of Coquille was held up today. Logging crews in the area were withdrawn to await between weather.
