Polling in the Nova Scotia provincial elections is taking place today under favorable weather conditions In the contest of four years ago the Conservative administration led by Hon. E. N. Rhodes, was swept into power, with forty seats out of a total of forty-three, defeating a Liberal government which had held office for forty-three years. The campaign which closes today has been lively and rather bitter but there does not appear to be any doubt as to the result. The Liberals have no hope of winning, but feel confident that they can reduce the government's majority and this will probably happen. In the late House the Liberals held one seat in Victoria and two in Antigonish. It is Breton constituencies.
