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## Of Interest to the Women

### SURVEY OF FALL FASHIONS

It is to fabric that the fall cos-  
tumes owe much of the new fashion  
interest. The beauty of material and  
effective color and media combina-  
tions are the last word in carrying  
out the ensemble idea.

Skirts for daytime wear are no  
longer than those introduced but not  
so generally accepted last spring.  
Fashion authorities seem to agree  
on allowing the skirt to fall two or  
three inches below the kneecap.

Burgundy wine shades are favored  
for street wear and afternoon cos-  
tumes. Acajou, which is another way  
of saying "mahogany" is the name  
of the color that is attracting con-  
siderable attention in kid shoes.

Fashion authorities tell us green  
is well worth watching. They see  
in it predictions for a leading color  
next spring. Green kid shoes are  
increasingly popular.

The high place attained by velvet  
and crepe satins gives strong em-  
phasis to black in afternoon cos-  
tumes. The smartest shoe comple-  
ment is a one strap or pump of  
black satin mat kid.

A recent survey of the woolen situ-  
ation shows that 50 per cent of  
American woolens are in some shade  
of brown, ranging from the beiges  
to the very dark, or tete de negre.

The range in new blues is almost  
as wide and varied as the browns.  
It runs from a bright sky, through  
the steel tones to a China and the  
independent or navy tones. The shoe  
color is a stranded navy, preferably  
in kid, which oddly enough blends  
with all tones.

Bronze kid is the latest addition  
to the brown shoe family. It comes  
in two tones—copper and burnt  
bronze, the latter almost as dark  
as tete de negre.

The vogue for navy blue has ex-  
tended to gloves. The stitchings and  
trims are usually in cream or gray.

### STUFFED TOMATO SALAD

- 6 medium sized tomatoes
- 1 cake creamed cheese
- Seasoning
- 1 small cucumber
- 1 teaspoon onion juice
- Mayonnaise

Peel the tomatoes remove thin  
slices from the top and take out the  
pulp. Cut the cucumber into small  
cubes, mix with the cream cheese  
and enough tomato pulp to moisten  
the mixture well. Season with salt  
pepper and paprika. Serve on let-  
tuce or watercress and garnish with  
mayonnaise or with Russian dress-  
ing.

### STUFFED EGG SALAD

- 5 hard cooked eggs
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1-2 tablespoon salad oil
- 1-2 teaspoon mustard
- Pepper
- 1-2 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Paprika
- 2 tablespoons minced meat, fish  
or pickles.

Cut the eggs in halves crosswise.  
Remove the yolks, mash and add the  
other ingredients mixing the season-  
ing well together before adding.  
Anchovies, sardines, ham or bacon  
give special savoriness. Refill the  
whites and arrange on lettuce or  
cabbage leaves. Garnish with stuffed  
olives or parsley.

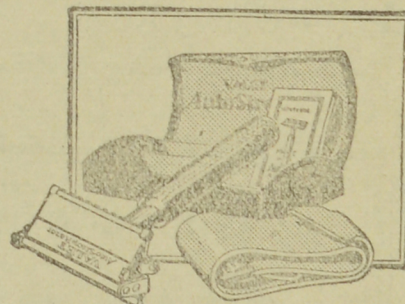
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
