

MORE TENDERS BEING CALLED FOR BRIDGES

The List Includes an Arch Culvert and Roadway Embankment in Parish of Burton, Sunbury County.

The New Brunswick Department of Public Works is calling for tenders for six more bridge projects in connection with the 1928 construction program of the Department.

One of the new projects is the Little Salmon River (No. 2 from mouth) Bridge on the Tobique Road, leading from Grand Falls to Plaster Rock in the Parish of Drummond, Victoria County, and the remaining five are Concrete Arch Culverts and Roadway Embankments as follows:

West (Upper) concrete arch culvert and roadway embankment on the road from Grand Falls to Van Buren, Maine, Parish of Grand Falls, Victoria County.

Milton (Albert) concrete arch culvert and roadway embankment, on the road from Hopewell to Albert in the Parish of Hopewell, Albert County.

Burpee concrete arch culvert and roadway embankment, on the Saint John River highway between Oromocto and Gagetown in the Parish of Burton, Sunbury County.

White concrete arch culvert and roadway embankment, on the road from Bourgeois Mill to Abouoggin, Parish of Shediac, Westmorland County.

Thebeau (Ambrose) concrete arch culvert and roadway embankment, Barriau to Acadiaville road in the Parish Acadiaville, Kent County.

A WELL KNOWN LADY PASSED AWAY TODAY

Mrs. F. B. Edgecombe Died at Noon Following a Stroke of Paralysis—Will Be Much Missed in the Community.

The death occurred at noon today of Mrs. Helen L. Edgecombe, wife of Mr. Frederick B. Edgecombe, the well-known dry goods merchant. The deceased had been in delicate health for some months and in January last, accompanied her husband on a cruise of the West Indies, but the trip failed to have the beneficial results which had been expected. Since her return home in April, the condition of Mrs. Edgecombe's health has kept her confined to her home the greater part of the time.

On Tuesday she suffered a paralytic stroke and at 7 o'clock this morning, lapsed into unconsciousness. Everything possible was done, but she failed to rally and at noon today she passed peacefully into the great beyond.

It was not generally known outside the family circle that Mrs. Edgecombe's condition was critical, and

DEVON MAN IS AWARDED THE CONTRACT

Thomas F. Miles Will Construct a Warehouse For The N. B. Liquor Control Board—Contract Price \$48,750.

The members of the New Brunswick Liquor Control Board met yesterday and awarded the contract for the proposed new warehouse to be erected on the barracks square to Thomas F. Miles of Devon. The tender of Mr. Miles was \$48,750 and was the lowest by over \$3,000. In all seven tenders were received, the highest being \$62,550. The contract price does not include heating or elevator work.

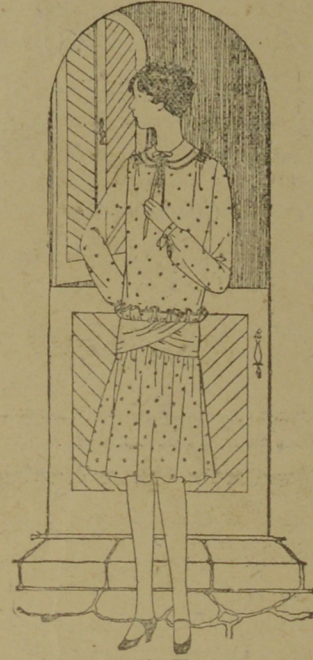
The building will be of brick and will be three and one-half stories high. Construction work will begin at once and the contractor will undertake to have the building ready for occupancy by November 1st.
